BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES \_\_\_\_\_ November 26, 1963

Due to the untimely passing and assassination of our late beloved President John Fitzgerald Kennedy on Friday, November 22, 1963, and the new President Lyndon B. Johnson having proclaimed Monday, November 25, 1963, a national day of mourning, all county offices closed in respect to his passing, and all business scheduled for November 25, 1963, was heard by the Board on Tuesday, November 26, 1963.

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The District Attorney presented the following letter to the Board:

"On Sunday, November 24, 1963, I was contacted by Mr. Ralph Erling of Radio Station KAHI and asked to make a statement on behalf of the Board regarding closure of county offices on Monday, November 25 in memory of our late president. Mr. Erling stated he was unable to contact Mr. D'Agostini by telephone and that he would like such a statement for early broadcast. Since I had contacted all Board members the previous day and knew of your decision to close county offices, I agreed to make the statement. After unsuccessfully trying to telephone Mr. D'Agostini, I recorded the following statement for rebroadcast on Radio Station KAHI:

'This is Jack Winkler, District Attorney for El Dorado County. I have been in communication with John D'Agostini, Chairman of the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors, and have been authorized to make the following statement on behalf of the Board of Supervisors:

'The people of El Dorado County join the rest of the nation in mourning the tragic death of our late president, John F. Kennedy. In accordance with the proclamations of President Johnson and Acting Governor Glenn Anderson, Monday, November 25, 1963, is declared to be a day of mourning throughout El Dorado County. All county offices, except emergency facilities, will be closed. All of our people are urged to offer their prayers for our late president and his family, and for President Linden B. Johnson and our nation in the difficult times which lie ahead.'

"I trust this met with your approval."

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Tuesday November 26, 1963

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On motion of Supervisor Chappie, seconded by Supervisor Chism, and carried, the Modification Lease with Donald Clarke for additional space in the <sup>C</sup>larke Building at Tahoe Valley, for use of the District Attorney's office, is approved and the Chairman authorized to sign.

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Assessor Thomas J. Sigwart submitted his report on lands available for County purchase or lease from the State, as referred to him on November 12, 1963. On motion of Supervisor Chappie, seconded by Supervisor Wallace, and carried, the District Attorney is authorized to pursue the matter, checking title to lands in Sopiago and Silver Lake areas and to report back to the Board at his earliest convenience.

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On motion of Supervisor Chappie, seconded by Supervisor Chism, and unanimously carried, the Chairman is authorized to send a letter to Mr. Alan S. Hart of the Division of Highways requesting immediate clarification on relocation or placement of signs on private property when a State highway is built, insofar as it affects the land owners on properties that have not been acquired.

On motion of Supervisor Caswell, seconded by Supervisor Wallace, and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Caswell, Chism, D'Agostini and Wallace; Noes: Supervisor Chappie; the Agreement with Richard C. Wolcott and Donald H. Goodrich for appraising property for the proposed County Government Center on Main Street is approved and the Chairman authorized to sign.

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On motion of Supervisor Caswell, seconded by Supervisor Chappie, and unanimously carried, the Chairman is authorized to send a letter to Cline, Zerkle & Agee, Architects, requesting a progress report on their preliminary plans for a Government Center on the Main Street site, and requesting an indication of when the Board may receive some recommendation for their perusal.

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On motion of Supervisor Chappie, seconded by Supervisor Chism, and unanimously carried, all Claims presented this day on the Warrant Register are approved and allowed for payment.

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At this point, Supervisor Chism departed.

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On motion of Supervisor Chappie, seconded by Supervisor Wallace, and carried, the matter of the 701 Planning Project program for Georgetown, Diamond Springs, El Dorado, Pollock Pines, Shingle Springs areas, is referred to the Chairman of the Planning Commission, the County Planning Director, the District Attorney and the District I Supervisor, and any interested party, for discussion relative to negotiating a contract.
