On motion of Supervisor Chism, seconded by Supervisor D'Agostini, and unanimously carried, the Board hereby amends the language of their reply to the Local Agency Formation Commission authorized on December 21, 1964, at a regular meeting of the Board, to read "In answer to your inquiry on annexations to existing districts" and deleting the wording "Georgetown Divide Public Utility District and South Tahoe Public Utility District", but still retaining the balance of the letter indicating board policy in the future can be determined by the annexations to the Local Agency Formation Commission as a strip annexation and including a copy of Resolution No. 31-60 as the Board's established policy at that time.
