On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Worrell, and unanimously carried, the Probation Deputy is allowed to take a County car home for night calls.

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Letter received from Director of Recreational Development requesting the Buildings & Grounds Department be authorized to construct tables and fire-places at the Sly Park, Finnon and Greenwood recreation areas at a cost not to exceed \$3,500.00. On motion of Supervisor Worrell, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried, the Recreation Director is authorized to bring a table in from the campgrounds to be used as a model and to advertise for informal bids for construction of tables.

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Memorandum received from Director of Recreational Development submitting a draft of resolution recommended by Auburn Dam Study Committee urging the Governor and the Legislature to seek the advice and consent of El Dorado County on legislation pertaining to Auburn-Folsom South Unit American River Central Valley Project. On motion of Supervisor Chism, seconded by Supervisor Worrell, and unanimously carried, the following resolution is passed and adopted:

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Mr. R. E. Bonney, Director of Recreational Development, presented his progress report with respect to the function and responsibility of the Recreation Department. On motion of Supervisor Ronzone, seconded by Supervisor Chism, and unanimously carried, the report is placed on file.

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Request from the Road Commissioner received, requesting that a 1964 12-ton Chevrolet pickup be transferred from the Building Department to the Road Department; estimated value, \$980.00, to come from the surplus in Budget Item #37 "Walters dump bed" and that an additional \$100 be allocated for replacement of the "Barden" bumper which has been removed. On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Chism, and unanimously carried, the request is approved.

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The Assistant County Counsel submitted an amendment to the Agreement between El Dorado County and San Joaquin County concerning their custody of our prisoners which makes allowances for the Work Furlough Program administered by San Joaquin County. On motion of Supervisor Chism, seconded by Supervisor Worrell, and unanimously carried, the Amendment is approved and the Chairman authorized to sign.

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On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Worrell, and unanimously carried, the letter from Mrs. Elizabeth Barber, submitted by the Assistant County Counsel, requesting that Donald C. Hoodenpyle, Donald L. Gassaway, K. W. Kluge, Tom Dawson and Elizabeth Barber be appointed to the Pollock Pines-Camino Fire Protection District for one-year terms, is continued until March 7, 1966.

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Letter received from the Southside County Water District stating that the terms of two directors will expire on March 22, 1966, and requesting reappointment of William Rhoads and Robert Domecq. On motion of Supervisor Worrell, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried, the following resolution is passed and adopted:

Specifications can be designed asking for limits of liability which would dovetail with the Association Plan." 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On motion of Supervisor Ronzone, seconded by Supervisor Chism, and unanimously carried, the Placerville City Council's letter and resolution recommending that the Division of Highways improve State Highway No. 193 is placed on file.

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Letter received from City of South Lake Tahoe submitting an agreement for approval for continuation of Health Department services to be provided by the County to the City. On motion of Supervisor Chism, seconded by Supervisor

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Walker, and unanimously carried, the Agreement between the County of El Dorado and the City of South Lake Tahoe for Health Department services to be provided by the County is approved and the Chairman authorized to sign.

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Letter received from the State Department of Veterans Affairs submitting an amendment to the Agreement for Allocation of State Aid to Counties for County Service Officers. On motion of Supervisor Chism, seconded by Supervisor Worrell, and unanimously carried, the Agreement is approved and the Chairman authorized to sign.

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Letter received from the U. S. Department of Commerce stating that the Placerville area has been designated as a redevelopment area under the Public Works and Economic Development Act of 1965, and the Overall Economic Development Program submitted by the County has been reapproved, and that qualifications for continued eligibility will be reviewed beginning 4/1/66 and El Dorado County should submit an OEDP Progress Report no later than March 31, 1966, describing our activities during 1965 as well as future program needs and objectives.

On motion of Supervisor Chism, seconded by Supervisor Worrell, and unanimously carried, the Administrative Assistant and Planning Director are authorized to complete and file a progress report by March 31, 1966.

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Letter received from Tahoe Paradise, Inc., requesting a resolution waiving the requirement for an engineering report on soil conditions in Tahoe Paradise Units 46 and 47. On motion of Supervisor Chism, seconded by Supervisor Ronzone, and unanimously carried, the following resolution is passed and adopted:

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Letter received from the Division of Highways stating that in their letter of January 20, 1966, they neglected to mention the necessity for all requests for accumulation of unexpended road funds include the parallel "plan" to meet the matching requirement of the Collier-Unruh Act and if a request is submitted under the "specific plan" there must be a plan for the expenditure of the accumulated 1.04¢ monies and secondly there must be a plan to accumulate the required matching funds. On motion of Supervisor Chism, seconded

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by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried, the letter is referred to the Road Commissioner.

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On motion of Supervisor Chism, seconded by Supervisor Worrell, and unanimously carried, the letter from McMahon Realty offering information regarding the renting or leasing of the Whitney Building in Tahoe Valley for County offices, is referred to the Administrative Assistant.

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Letter received from The Reclamation Board suggesting that a procedure be established wherein the counties transmit to the Reclamation Board for its review and comment, a copy of all tentative subdivision plans of those lands adjacent to or in close proximity to all rivers, streams, sloughs, channels, whose waters are a part of or drain into the Sacramento or San Joaquin Rivers and stating they will schedule a meeting with our County officials to discuss the matter further. On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Chism, and unanimously carried, the letter is placed on file until a meeting is scheduled, and a copy is to be forwarded to the Planning Department.

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Letter received from Attorneys Boon & Sparks enclosing a Stop Notice on behalf of Dennis Coleman, dba C & M Construction Co., to withhold funds due TAB Construction Co. in regard to labor and materials furnished under Contract No. 2 relating to Tahoe Paradise Unit No. 34 Assessment District, and requesting they be advised of the status of funds presently held by the County. On motion of Supervisor Chism, seconded by Supervisor Ronzone, and unanimously carried, the letter is referred to the County Counsel.

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Mr. Ronald Crowe of Pine Belt Helicopters met with the Board to discuss a business permit at the Lake Tahoe Airport. On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Worrell, and unanimously carried, the County Counsel is authorized to prepare a notice to be sent to Bridgeford Flying Service advising them to make arrangements to provide fixed wing maintenance within 60 days as per their contract.

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On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Worrell, and unanimously carried, all Claims presented this day on the Warrant Register are approved and allowed for payment.

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Letter presented by the Administrative Assistant on the Chief Building Inspector's report on building permits within the City of South Lake Tahoe,

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referred to him on February 14, 1966, setting out the following recommendations:

- Approve the Chief Building Inspector's recommendation for a conversion from County to City Building Department, effective March 1, 1966;
- Instruct the County Counsel to prepare a proper agreement to effect the transfer of duties;
- 3. Contact city offices by telephone to advise of the Board's action;
- 4. Instruct the Chief Building Inspector to work out the procedural details of the transfer. With respect to this, it would appear important that all county records pertaining to uncompleted inspections be retained by the county. It should be possible to close off uncompleted inspections in county files by job card and have these inspections picked up in city files by their job cards. Job card notations in county files could then denote: "job card closed due to transfer of function to city; refer to City Building Department." The city's job card would read: "prior inspections by county; refer to County Building Department."

On motion of Supervisor Chism, seconded by Supervisor Worrell, and unanimously carried, the Administrative Assistant's recommendations are approved and the County Counsel is requested to carry forth with a transfer of duties and monies that are due the City of South Lake Tahoe under the incompleted inspection program.

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On motion of Supervisor Chism, seconded by Supervisor Worrell, and unanimously carried, the Purchasing Agent is authorized to procure a surgical light for the surgical suite at the County Hospital from American Sterilization for the sum of \$1,950.00, and the bidding requirement is waived as there is an urgent need for the equipment.

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On motion of Supervisor Chism, seconded by Supervisor Worrell, and unanimously carried, the Chairman is authorized to sign a letter to President Lyndon B.
