BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES \_\_\_\_\_ May 31 1966

The Board convened in regular meeting. Present: Supervisors R. G. Chism, Ray Lawyer, Joseph D. Ronzone, H. F. Walker and W. C. Worrell; also Barbara L. Cook, Clerk to the Board. Chairman Lawyer presiding.

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On motion of Supervisor Worrell, seconded by Supervisor Chism, and unanimously carried, the Agenda is adopted.

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On motion of Supervisor Chism, seconded by Supervisor Worrell, and unanimously carried, the minutes of May 23, 1966, are approved as submitted.

On motion of Supervisor Chism, seconded by Supervisor Worrell, and unanimously carried, mileage and expense are approved for the following to attend meetings:

The Administrative Assistant recommended that a LHR 250-1ehange order be authorized to enclose the windows in the surgery suite as per the report from the Department of Public Health.

On motion of Supervisor Chism, seconded by Supervisor Worrell, and unanimously carried, the recommendation of the Administrative Assistant is approved. After further discussion, this motion was withdrawn, and on motion of Supervisor Ronzone, seconded by Supervisor Chism, and unanimously carried, a Change Order is authorized to correct the deficiency with glass

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or block.

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LHR 250-10n motion of Supervisor Ronzone, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried, the Administrative Assistant is authorized to proceed as necessary with vinyl wall covering in the surgery room at the County Hospital.

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Letter received from Mrs. Nestor E. Pearson stating she feels she is entitled to her late husband's disability insurance from his  $17\frac{1}{2}$  years as a County employee, and requesting the Board to look into the matter. On motion of Supervisor Ronzone, seconded by Supervisor Chism, and unanimously carried, the matter is referred to the County Counsel for report back to the Board on June 6, 1966.

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On motion of Supervisor Chism, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried, the letter from the Division of Highways stating that on July 1, 1966, State Route 188 lying in the County of El Dorado between the south end of Fallen Leaf Lake and State Highway Route 89 near Camp Richardson will be relinquished to the County, is placed on file.

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Letter received from the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board stating they are forming an advisory committee to provide guide lines for water quality control policy formulation, and inviting the Board to attend the first committee meeting to be held June 8 at 10:00 A.M. in Room 849, Resources Building, Sacramento. On motion of Supervisor Chism, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried, Supervisor Worrell will attend the meeting and represent the Board and make any statements on behalf of the County.

- Approval of construction drawings and specifications by Road Commissioner and County Engineer prior to proceeding with any subdivision work;
- 2. Completion of road improvements, lot accesses, drainage systems and water systems, and setting of final monuments in accordance with requirements of the Engineering, Road and Health Departments, County Surveyor, and the El Dorado County Subdivision Ordinance or execution of an agreement to install these improvements and monuments secured by bond or cash deposit.

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#### GENERAL ORDERS

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Proper notices having been mailed, hearing held on escaped assessment. No protestants appearing, on motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Ronzone, and unanimously carried, Change in Assessment Roll #80, Wayne D. Butler, is approved.

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Mr. Dan Birtwell, President of the Employees Association, was present regarding the employees salary survey.

LHR 82-2 The Administrative Assistant recommended that he be authorized to make a thorough, objective salary survey, assisted by a committee to be comprised of two members from the Board of Supervisors, two members from the Employees Association Board of Directors, and the County Counsel.

Mr. Birtwell stated the Employees Association is in favor of the committee

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and recommends that Section 4107 of the Salary Ordinance be amended to LHR 82-2 allow a salary survey to be made in the slack period of the year, to take effect January 1, 1967.

On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Ronzone, and unanimously carried, the Administrative Assistant's recommendation is approved.

On motion of Supervisor Chism, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried, Supervisors Worrell and Walker are appointed to the committee.

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On motion of Supervisor Worrell, seconded by Supervisor Chism, and unanimously carried, all Claims presented this day on the Warrant Register are approved and allowed for payment.

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LHR 151-5On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Chism, and unanimously carried, the Chairman is authorized to sign the Election Form for Group Health Care Policy Revision to Accommodate Medicare Legislation to the Pacific National Life Assurance Company, indicating that the County prefers Plan II.

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At this point Supervisor Ronzone departed.

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On motion of Supervisor Chism, seconded by Supervisor Worrell, and carried, the Chairman is authorized to sign Change Order No. 1 for Tahoe Paradise Unit No. 33 Assessment District, in the amount of \$5,640.00.

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LHR 82-2 On motion of Supervisor Worrell, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and carried, the Administrative Assistant is directed to make a salary survey of all County departments, starting approximately September 1, to be finalized no later than November 30, 1966.

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Supervisor Ronzone returned.

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On motion of Supervisor Chism, seconded by Supervisor Worrell, and unanimously carried, the Chairman is authorized to execute a new contract with Wilsey, Ham & Blair, the County of Placer, City of Auburn and El Dorado County for an impact study on the Auburn Dam.

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On motion of Supervisor Chism, seconded by Supervisor Worrell, and unanimously carried, the Administrative Assistant is authorized mileage and expense to San Francisco on June 3 to attend an emergency meeting regarding AB 5.

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On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Worrell, and unanimously carried, a budget transfer for Sly Park is approved, transferring \$528 from Fixed Assets to Salaries and Wages.

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On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Chism, and unanimously carried, a Lease with American Forests Products Corporation for proposed dump site "A" at Pollock Pines is approved for a three-year period with an option to renew after two years, at \$30.00 per month commencing June 10, 1966, and the Chairman is authorized to sign.

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On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Chism, and unanimously carried, Supervisor Worrell is authorized to negotiate a Lease with Victor Bullard, et al, for the parking lot adjacent to the County Office Center for a three-year period, with a two-year option to renew, at a cost of \$300 per month.

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On motion of Supervisor Worrell, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried, the Buildings and Grounds Department is authorized to place identifying signs on the proposed El Dorado County Government Center site after approval is obtained from Mr. A. T. Hildman.

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There being no further business, the Board adjourned to reconvene on Monday, June 6, 1966, at 9:30 A.M.
