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The County Administrator submitted his 1968 salary recommendations. On motion of Supervisor Ronzone, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried, the report was taken under advisement, and the Board set a Policy Review Session on March 12, 1968, at 9:00 A.M. to review the recommendations.

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Letter received from the County Administrator stating there are several pending classification matters that warrant study as soon as possible and recommending that the County engage the services of the State Personnel Board (Cooperative Personnel Services) to conduct classification studies. On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and unanimously carried, the Board authorized a Contract with Griffenhagen-Kroeger & Associates to conduct a classification study, with a report within 30 days, for positions as submitted by the County Administrator, and the Chairman was authorized to sign.

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On motion of Supervisor Lawyer, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unani-LHR 157-2 mously carried, the Chairman was authorized to sign the Agreement with El

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Dorado Irrigation District for Maintenance and Operation of Water System for Lake Hills Estates, effective April 1, 1968, at a cost of \$300 per month.

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Letter received from the El Dorado County Chamber of Commerce stating the Chamber's Public Affairs Council and Board of Directors have formally endorsed the proposal of the Citizens Committee calling for the refurbishing of the County Courthouse on Main Street for use as a central courts facility by the County. On motion of Supervisor Martin, seconded by Supervisor Ronzone, and unanimously carried, the letter was placed on file.

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Letter received from Assemblyman Mike Cullen enclosing a copy of Assembly Bill #678 relative to public employment relations and requesting that the Board submit any comments or suggestions they might have for changes in the proposed bill. On motion of Supervisor Martin, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried, the letter was placed on file.

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Letter received from Dr. Howard S. Bliss, Chief of Staff of Marshall Hospital, expressing concern over the shortage of public health sanitarians in the county and recommending that steps be taken to lead to a more active recruitment policy and to make the position more attractive and competitive with other counties. On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and unanimously carried, the letter was placed on file.

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Letter received from KVIE, Channel 6, stating they have adopted plans to place Channel 6 on the Tall Tower at Walnut Grove which will give perfect picture reception throughout Central and Northern California and they would appreciate support from El Dorado County. On motion of Supervisor Lawyer, seconded by Supervisor Martin, and unanimously carried, the matter was referred to the County Administrator for review during the budget process.

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On motion of Supervisor Martin, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and unanimously carried, all Claims presented on the Warrant Register were approved and allowed for payment.

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Supervisor Walker returned.

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The motion made by Supervisor Ronzone, seconded by Supervisor Walker, to request the County Administrator to make application for acquisition of the old Post Office Building on Main Street for library services in El Dorado County was withdrawn until the hearing on the library later this date.

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On motion of Supervisor Martin, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried, the Chairman was authorized to sign the Statement of Intention to Designate a Community Action Agency, to be forwarded to the Office of Economic Opportunity, stating the County intends to operate the Community Action Agency.

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On motion of Supervisor Martin, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried, the Board changed the date of the hearing on the proposal to form a Municipal Court in El Dorado County from March 11, 1968, to March 18, 1968, at 8:00 P.M. in the Multi-purpose Building at the Fairgrounds, and the County Administrator was authorized to send a letter to Mr. Vern Jacobson of the Judicial Council of the State of California inviting him to attend the meeting.

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On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Ronzone, and unani-LHR 308-2 mously carried, the Chairman was authorized to sign the Assurance of Compliance with the Department of Commerce Regulations under Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, for Project #07-6-09159, the El Dorado County Economic Development Research Program.

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On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Martin, and unanimously carried, the Chairman was authorized to send a letter to Xerox Corporation terminating the Copy/Duplicating Service Agreement in 15 days, for the 20-Bin Sorter.

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Supervisor Ronzone departed.

On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Martin, and carried, the request from the Employee Association that a minimum of \$175,000 be included in the budget for fiscal year 1968-69 for salary adjustments, was referred to the County Administrator to be included in the various budgets.

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Supervisor Ronzone returned.

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Questionnaire received from Assemblyman Leon Ralph regarding legislation being considered which would transfer the cost and operation of all Department of Social Welfare programs from the county to the State with concomitant tax relief to the counties. On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Martin, and unanimously carried, the Board stated the opinion that they support legislation for the State to assume the total cost and operation of welfare programs.

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A discussion was held concerning the problem of housing the County Library's Main Branch. Approximately 40 people were present including County Librarian Vera Fitch, Mr. Phillip Berry representing the Friends of the Library, and Mrs. Beth Ledbetter, Mrs. Gladys Bond, Mrs. Lois Wilson, and Mr. Philip Brotherton, members of the Library Commission. Mr. Berry presented a resolution of the Executive Board of the Friends of the Library in which they oppose any move to split the library and favor keeping it in a building adequate for the complete Library facility, and favoring a centrally located Library in the downtown Placerville area. After discussion, on motion of Supervisor Ronzone, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Ronzone, Worrell, Lawyer, and Martin; Abstaining: Supervisor Walker; the Board supported the Resolution of the Executive Board of the Friends of the Library, and the Chairman to appoint a committee

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to find adequate facilities for temporary housing of the Main Branch Library, preferably on Main Street in Placerville.

The Chairman appointed Supervisor Ronzone to a committee to locate a facility acceptable to the Friends of the Library and the Library Commission, and to work with whom he deems necessary.

On motion of Supervisor Ronzone, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried, the County Administrator was instructed to make application for the old Post Office Building on Main Street in Placerville for the Placerville Library, and the Board requested support from the Friends of the Library, Library Commission and Librarian in the shortest possible time.
