NEW BUSINESS

Daryl McKinstry, County Counsel, advised the Board that Water Agency meeting had inadvertently been scheduled for Tuesday, February 4, 1969 at 2:00 p.m. The Board rescheduled next regular meeting for Tuesday, February 11, 1969 at 11:00 a.m. with subsequent regular meetings to be held on the first Tuesday of each month at 11:00 a.m.

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County Counsel presented contents of proposals for a Mobile Home Ordinance for the Board's comments and consideration.

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Supervisor Goodloe presented a complaint from property owners concerning access to Missouri Flat Road, across and onto railroad property, to their residences. County Counsel and G. Arthur Cort, Director of Public Works, were instructed to attempt to secure releases from property owners and report back to the Board on motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried.

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Supervisor Goodloe presented a proposed draft of a "Sex Education" Bill to
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LHR 216 be introduced in the State Legislature by State Senator John Schmitz and
moved that the Board adopt a resolution supporting the bill. The motion
