BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES _____ June 17 ____ 19_69

The Board of Supervisors convened in regular meeting this 17th day of June, 1969 with the following present: Supervisors John M. Caswell, William V.D. Johnson, Thomas M. Goodloe, Jr., Raymond E. Lawyer and Gerald E. Martin. Also: Carl A. Kelly, Clerk of the Board; Daryl J. McKinstry, County Counsel; and J. Mark Nielsen, County Administrator. Chairman Martin presided.

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Fred G. DeBerry, County Surveyor, presented a request that Ordinance No. 454, 390-9 Citing Section 9336 of the Subdivision Ordinance, be rescinded as a step to clarify the Subdivision Ordinance. Planning Director had concurred with the request. The matter was continued for one week and referred to County Counsel for a report on motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and unanimously carried.

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A Grant Agreement from FAA for Placerville Airport, to regrade, strengthen, ^{HR 30-5}pave and mark Runway 5-23; strengthen taxiway turnaround; install MIRL on Runway 5-23, including beacon and lighted wind cone, with cost of the project not to exceed \$129,300.00, was continued to next regular meeting on motion of Supervisor Caswell, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried.

County Administrator presented matters (not on agenda) on subject of EDA Grant Applications, Placerville Airport Runway and Apron Projects, with HR 30-5 the recommendation that the Board adopt separate resolutions registering Board Intent to commit local participation as follows: \$48,229.00 for the runway project (original estimate \$44,517); \$11,200.00 for the apron project (original estimate \$8,000).

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Paul A. The Agreement was approved and Chairman authorized to execute on motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Goodloe, and unanimously carried.

David C. Lyons, Purchasing Agent, presented a rental contract with Addressograph Multigraph Corporation for a 2000 Copier for County Recorder's Office, at the rate of \$67.10 per month.

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The Pollock Pines Chamber of Commerce requested approval of the Board to paint Pony Express emblems on Blair Road and Pony Express Trail, for Pony Express Days on July 4, 1969. The request was approved on motion of Supervisor Lawyer, seconded by Supervisor Caswell, and unanimously carried.

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A request from Dry Diggins Jaycees that the members of the Board of Supervisors appear as dignitaries in the Wagon Train Days Parade on July 20, 1969, was placed on file on motion of Supervisor Lawyer, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried.
