- Costs for collection of taxes applied to the 13,000 EID parcels using the normal rate times Assessed Valuation (land only) would be absorbed by the County.
- 2. Collection of direct taxes would be charged on the same basis now used for 1915 bonds, etc., i.e., 1% of value of tax levy. This would mean that for the 1,500 parcels now having EID direct taxes, the cost to EID would be approximately \$2,200-\$2,500 for 1970-71.
- 3. The Assessor's investment of \$2,250 for converting his records to reflect the new code area structure would be absorbed consistent with prior changes performed along the same lines with no County charges.
- 4. Extra copies of the tax roll or any additional work performed directly by the Data Processing Department would be charged to EID on a fee for service basis.
