Airports Manager was present and read a draft of a letter to the City Manager, City of South Lake Tahoe, which stated that after careful review of the Uniform Building Code, that the wood shake roofing for the Lake Tahoe Terminal Building is suitable and would in no way pose a hazard to surrounding buildings, and is consistent with the standards and objectives of the Uniform Building Code. J. A. Thoney, County Building Official, was also present and concurred completely with the statements contained in the proposed letter.

At the request of Mr. Harold Zollinger, Sacramento Public Housing Administration, who was to appear before the Board at 2:00 P.M. to discuss Public Housing for limited income families, on motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Martin, and unanimously carried, the matter was continued to March 17, 1970, at 10:45 A.M. (Continued from March 3, 1970).

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Communication received from Charles F. Goodspeed, Executive Secretary, California Bicentennial Celebration Commission, requesting the Board appoint a County Bicentennial Chairman by April 1, 1970, in order to coordinate local County programs and assist in various State-wide projects celebrating California's 200th Birthday. On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Martin, and unanimously carried, the communication was placed on file.

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Communication received from State Department of Parks and Recreation requesting a list be submitted to them in connection with the National Historic Preservation Act containing sites, structures, building, and districts significant to California history for possible placement in the National Register so that Government, groups, and citizens may know what should be protected from destruction or impairment; and suggesting a committee be formed to accomplish this. The motion of Supervisor Martin to adopt an ordinance, to be applied on an individual basis only, was lost due to the lack of a second.

The Board informally continued the matter to March 17, 1970, at 2:15 P.M. to afford sufficient time for County Counsel to review the matter from a legal standpoint.

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Mr. Jack Moore, Timber Manager, Eldorado National Forest, was present at 2:30 P.M., and discussed the Forest Service's interest and findings relative to Project FORCE (Forest Operation, Re-utilization, and Conservation Enterprise) -- a work training project conducted in conjunction with the Eldorado National Forest: Funds to come from the U.S. Department of Labor, with a funding level of \$225,000.00; a project brought to the Board for consideration by the El Dorado County Community Action Council, Inc.

On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Martin, and unanimously carried, the Board affirmed its interest in the intent of the project, but stated its desire to study various factors involved in more detail before it proceeds further on the matter. (Continued from March 3, 1970)
