On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Caswell, and unanimously carried, Mr. DuFort's resignation was accepted, and a replacement appointment is to be made after the September meeting of the Mental Health Advisory Board.

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LHR Lloyd B. Hamilton requested permission to resign as District Attorney effective September 1, 1970. On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Goodloe, and unanimously carried, the resignation was accepted and Terrence M. Finney was appointed as District Attorney, effective September 1, 1970.

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Bid opening was held June 18, 1970, for Placerville Airport to Grade and Pave Taxiways A, C, and D, and bids were received from A. Teichert & Son, Sacramento; Michael Harms, Sacramento; Wolin & Sons, Sutter Creek; and Claude C. Wood Co., Lodi. (Original bids on file in the Board of Supervisors Office).

At the recommendation of the Airports Manager, on motion of Supervisor Martin, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Caswell, Johnson, Lawyer, and Martin; No: Supervisor Goodloe, the bid was awarded to the low bidder, A. Teichert & Son, Sacramento.

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At the recommendation of the Airports Manager, on motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Martin, and unanimously carried, Change Order No. 1 for Placerville Airport Taxiway project was approved reducing contract by \$,090.00.

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At the recommendation of the Airports Manager, on motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Caswell, and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Caswell, Johnson, Lawyer, and Martin; No: Supervisor Goodloe, the Agreement between the County and Reinard W. Brandley dated December 2, 1968, and amended May 8, 1970, for the Placerville Airport Runway was amended to include design and engineer's work with Mr. Brandley for the Placerville Airport Taxiway project.

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Director of Public Works recommended the use of the Union Mine Dump site for disposal of pesticide containers as long as it is operated as a sanitary land fill. On motion of Supervisor Caswell, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried, the Director of Public Works recommendation was approved.

Letter received from County Supervisors Association requesting completion of report form on the 13th Annual California County Employee Safety Contest to be forwarded to contest co-sponsor, State Compensation Insurance Fund prior to August 1, 1970. On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Caswell, and unanimously carried, the matter was referred to the County Administrator.

Letter received from James E. Jensen, Executive Officer, State Senate Rules Committee, congratulating Board members and County employees for the fine service provided; i.e. snow removal system, the Sheriff's Patrol; the personnel in the Building Permit Office in South Lake Tahoe; and the Road Department for resurfacing some of the streets in the Tahoe Cedars Subdivision; and requesting that thanks be passed on and that appropriate notations be made in the personnel files of those providing said services.

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Goodloe, and unanimously carried, the Clerk was directed to forward copies of said letter to the appropriate departments, and the original letter was placed on file.

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Caswell, and unanimously carried, the U.S. Bureau of Census form received requesting amounts of long-term borrowing anticipated for the next four quarters, was referred to the County Auditor.

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#### On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Caswell, and unanimously carried, the U. S. Bureau of Census form received requesting Survey of Expenditure and Employment for Selected Criminal Justice Activities of Local Governments, was referred to the County Administrator.

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Communication received from the State Public Utilities Commission inquiring as to the manner in which special assessments for water plant backup fees are determined; what controls are maintained by the County; whether the County Engineer and the Engineer of Work verify the need for, and amount of backup fees required.

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Goodloe, and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Caswell, Johnson, Goodloe, and Lawyer; Abstain: Supervisor Martin, the matter was referred to the Director of Public Works and to County Counsel to determine if the State Public Utilities Commission wants the County to take some control over the funds, and if so, to draft an ordinance accordingly.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES July 7, 1970

The County Building Committee proposed that an El Dorado Building Advisory Group be formally designated, consisting of Grand Jury Foremen of the last six Grand Juries, to be charged and authorized to:

- 1. Review and evaluate the County facility needs of the County Government in the Tahoe Basin and the County seat;
- 2. Review and evaluate possible methods of financing;
- 3. Propose augmentation of the Group if it so desires;
- 4. Advise the Board of Supervisors, making recommendations as it deems appropriate, concerning courses of action;
- 5. Utilize staff assistance of the County Administrator as desired.

On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Martin, and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Johnson, Goodloe, and Martin; Noes: Supervisors Caswell and Lawyer, the Building Committee's recommendation that an El Dorado Building Advisory Group consist of the Grand Jury Foremen of the last six Grand Juries, was denied.

Dr. James Worhington, Chairman, Government Affairs Committee of the Hangtown Chamber of Commerce, was present and stated that the Building Program should not be delayed for any reason at all, and enumerated the priorities in which the program should proceed: (1) Juvenile Hall; (2) Expansion of Jail facilities at South Lake Tahoe; (3) Acquire the Porter Muffler Building; (4) Government office building at South Lake Tahoe. He further stated that an architect should be hired immediately to proceed as rapidly as possible for plans in the aforesaid order, in order to avoid increased costs caused by any delays.

The motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, to consider the Juvenile Hall the first priority, and select an architect immediately to handle the job, was lost by reason of the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Johnson and Goodloe; Noes: Supervisors Caswell, Lawyer, and Martin.

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Chairman Lawyer released a prepared statement on the new County telephone system: CENTREX; to be in operation in Placerville on September 19, 1970, making it possible for local residents to dial directly to individual County offices by dialing a new prefix for this area: 626. Chairman Lawyer stated that estimated actual savings to the County would be in excess of \$500.00 each month. On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Martin, and unanimously carried, the statement was placed on file.

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At the request of Scott Brothers, Inc., on motion of Supervisor Caswell, seconded by Supervisor Goodloe, and unanimously carried, the Appeal of Scott Brothers, Inc. on the Planning Commission's denial of a Special Use Permit to locate a 14' X 48' direction sign for Sam's Stage Coach Inn in the Shingle Springs area, was extended to September 15, 1970, and the Board Clerk was directed to so notify Scott Brothers, Inc.

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Regional Director, Office of Economic Opportunity, submitted for Board approval Community Action Program Grant No. CG 9013 for Program Year A, to assist in financing the Alcoholic Halfway House Program, to be effective September 1, 1970 through February 28, 1972. (No County funds involved).

On motion of Supervisor Caswell, seconded by Supervisor Goodloe, and unanimously carried, the Chairman was authorized to sign the Statement of CAP Grant.

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County Welfare Director submitted for Board consideration and approval a proposed County Plan for Use of Volunteers for Fiscal Year 1970-71, as required of the El Dorado County Welfare Department by delegation of the Director of Social Welfare, for the purpose of formulating plans for recruitment, utilization, and training of volunteers to assist in performing services for the County public social services: said plan cannot become effective until approved by resolution of the Board of Supervisors; pursuant to Section 10616 of the Welfare and Institutions Code.

On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried, the request for approval of the Welfare Volunteer Plan was denied.

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Martin, and unanimously carried, the Director of Public Works was authorized funds not to exceed \$500.00 on time and material basis to investigate the Courthouse roof for structural deficiencies.

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On motion of Supervisor Martin, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried, the request of subdivider, LeRoy Lampson, to extend for one year the tentative map of Echo View Estates Unit No. 3, was approved, and the tentative map was extended to July 8, 1971.

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There being no further business, the Board adjourned to Tuesday, July 14, 1970, at 8:00 A.M.
