BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES ______ January 19, ____ 1971__

The Board convened in regular meeting. Present: Supervisors William V. D. Johnson, Thomas M. Goodloe, Jr., and Thomas L. Stewart. Supervisors John M. Caswell and Raymond E. Lawyer were absent. Also present: Ann R. Macy, Board of Supervisors Clerk. Chairman Johnson presided.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was led by Supervisor Goodloe.

The Agenda was adopted on motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present.

The Minutes of January 12, 1971, were approved as submitted on motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present.

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GENERAL ORDERS

On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried by those present, Warrant Register Claims were approved for payment, with the exception of Warrant Nos. 20083; 19873; 19960; and 19942, which were held for more detailed information.

On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried by those present, the Claim of James D. Worthington in the amount of \$3,500.00 for alleged damage to his property on Coloma Road, Placerville, was referred to County Counsel.

On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present, the property damage claim in the amount of \$429.34 filed by Allstate Insurance Company, involving a County vehicle driven by Michael John Mergen, was referred to County Counsel.

County Administrator submitted two alternate schedules of the 1971-72 budget calendar, with the request that the Board select one; either Schedule A, or Schedule B, as well as issue any special budget instructions deemed appropriate.

On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board adopted Schedule B, with the following changes: The County Administrator was directed to submit a schedule for budget review of Department Heads to the Board on February 1, 1971 (this is an addition to the Schedule); the date that the Board conducts (Continued)

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"Pre-Proposed Budget" deliberations was changed from May 4, 1971, to May 11, 1971.

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Assessor submitted letter stating that George B. Cosens has elected to exercise Option "C" cancelling the Land Conservation Agreement on Agricultural Preserve No. 55, for the total Cancellation Valuation of \$1,445.90.

On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present, the Cancellation Valuation was accepted, and the Chairman was authorized to sign Cancellation of Agreement.

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Civil Defense Area Coordinator requested adoption of a resolution authorizing William V. D. Johnson, Chairman of the Board, and George M. Smith, Civil Defense Area Coordinator, to sign applications and documents for obtaining financial assistance under the Federal Civil Defense Act of 1950.

On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present, the following resolution was adopted, and the Clerk was directed to include in the Minutes that this also entails the duty of review and approval by the Chairman of the Board:

On motion of Supervisor Stewart, seconded by Supervisor Goodloe, and unanimously carried by those present, the Chairman was authorized to sign Certificate of Acceptance of Grant Deed.

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Chairman Johnson appointed Supervisors Goodloe and Caswell as a Board Committee to study the Uniform Fire Code, and on motion of Supervisor Stewart, seconded by Supervisor Goodloe, and unanimously carried, the appointment was approved.

Chairman Johnson requested consideration of referring the Ordinance Relating to the Regulating and Licensing of Outdoor Music Festivals to the Planning Commission for review and coordination with various County departments involved.

On motion of Supervisor Stewart, seconded by Supervisor Goodloe, and unanimously carried by those present, the matter was approved for referral to the Planning Commission as suggested.

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Supervisor Stewart recommended the following in relation to the payment by the County of various national, state, regional, and county organization membership dues: (1) Elected County Officials - County to pay if specifically related to their official elected positions; (2) Employed Personnel - County to pay if specifically related to position held; provided that said membership is a prerequisite to employment as now required by County policy.

On motion of Supervisor Stewart, seconded by Supervisor Goodloe, and unanimously carried by those present, the matter was referred to the County Administrator with instructions that the Personnel Officer report to the Board on January 26, 1971, if any of the membership dues that have been paid by the County are a prerequisite to employment.

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County Counsel submitted for approval the Modification of Agreement Providing for the Administration on War on Poverty Programs in El Dorado County between the Community Action Agency and the El Dorado Community Action Council, Inc.

On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present, the Agreement was approved and the Chairman authorized to sign, after the following changes have been made: Page 4, Line 7, the word "except" to be added at the end of the line; and Page 5, Lines 1 and 2 to read, . . . "of any amendment shall be made in public meetings by both the governing board and the administering board and . . . ".

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Director of Community Programs requested consideration of a proposed alternative plan to renovate the Community Center on Pacific Street on a self-help basis; to be used by senior citizens activities within El Dorado County.

On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board approved that the funds set aside for the Housing and Urban Development application, be released for the renovation project on a self-help basis.

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Director of Veterans Services reported regarding the request from the National Committee - Jobs for Veterans, urging community participation in a local "Jobs for Veterans Task Force", that El Dorado County has instituted a Veterans Preference Program in the past years; however, due to the present economy in this County, unlimited job opportunities are at a stand-still.

On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present, the Director of Veterans Services was requested to reply to the National Committee as outlined in his report to the Board.

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County Counsel reported on the question of whether it is legal to carry vacation time over from year to year, and stated that pursuant to County Ordinance Code Section 4129, that the Board would be in a position to consider it "unfair" to not allow a vacation carry-over if, for instance, a person could not, because of workload reasons, take his vacation before a loss occured. (Referred November 24, 1970, Re: Agricultural Commissioner's request)

On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present, the matter was referred to the Board's Personnel Committee for recommendation.
