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Communication received from Irwin E. Bosworth, Forest Supervisor, informing the Board of the U.S. Forest Service's intent to purchase land from members of South Tahoe Valhalla, Inc., located between Pope Beach and Baldwin Beach, Lake Tahoe, and stating that a Land Purchase Option and Contract has been executed.

On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried, the communication was placed on file.

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following was stated: That during 1968-69 his agency acquired excess government property consisting for the most part of buses, pickups, and trucks which were issued on a contract basis to various school districts and fire departments within El Dorado County for their use through designated OEO programs; That during the first part of 1970, his office was notified by the Regional Office of Economic Opportunity that the assignment of the vehicles to local agencies was not legal, and it was requested that the vehicles be returned to the General Services Administration; That his office had made several attempts to negotiate with the State Civil Defense Director and the State Surplus Property Agent in Sacramento; however, none of these negotiations were fruitful insofar as the GSA was concerned; and That another letter was received from the Regional OEO Office requesting the return of the vehicles by no later than July 1, 1971.

individual fire departments to bring the equipment up to operating condition and to keep the equipment in good repair; the funds expended totalled \$20,670.96.

Members of the school districts, as well as fire departments, were present and expressed grave concern over the amount of money they had spent on the acquired vehicles.

Mr. Dean McGrath, representative of the State Office of OEO, Sacramento, was also present and stated that he would intervene, if the Board so desired, in an attempt to rectify the problem.

On motion of Supervisor Caswell, seconded by Supervisor Goodloe, and unanimously carried, the Board directed that all local public agencies in possession of this excess government property who are possibly subject to returning said equipment to the General Services Administration, to file all pertinent information within two weeks with the County Administrator, who in turn was directed to immediately compile an explanation of this local problem to be forwarded to our national legislators, the State OEO Office, and to any other interested parties who could be beneficial in helping to resolve this problem.

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Communication received from Robert Mason, Architect, County Courthouse Remodel Project, submitting for the Chairman's signature, Notice of Completion by contractor, Buettner, Carter & Denton & Associates, Inc., and stating that a final inspection had been made by the Director of Public Works and himself, and the work was found to be substantially complete in accordance with the contract documents.
