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Sheriff Ernest Carlson submitted a letter advising the Board that the State Department of Justice will require a fee of \$3.10 for processing all non-criminal fingerprints; and also requesting that the service of fingerprinting County employees be transferred to the County Administrator's Office.

The motion of Supervisor Caswell to adopt the following resolution amending the Authorized Personnel Resolution as outlined by the County Administrator, to be effective September 4, 1971, was seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and amended by Supervisor Stewart to include that all personnel matters to come before the Board in the future would be reviewed at 9:00 o'clock each Tuesday morning before the Board meeting. The Chairman called for Supervisor Caswell's concurrence, and failing to receive it, the amendment to the motion was seconded by Supervisor Goodloe.

The Chairman called for the vote on the amendment and it carried as follows: Ayes: Supervisors Johnson, Goodloe, and Stewart. Noes: Supervisors Caswell and Lawyer.

The Chairman then called for the vote on the original motion to amend the Authorized Personnel Resolution and it carried as follows: Ayes: Supervisors Caswell, Lawyer, and Stewart; Noes: Supervisors Johnson and Goodloe, and the following resolution was adopted, effective September 4, 1971:

AMENDING THE AUTHORIZED PERSONNEL RESOLUTION

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On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Caswell, and unanimously carried, the Board authorized that the essential parts of the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency lawsuit be reproduced for use in the County Libraries, as well as for other distribution; and the costs of such reproduction to be taken from the Board of Supervisors' budget category 2-23 (Special Departmental Expense).

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There being no further business, the Board adjourned to Tuesday, August 31, 1971, at 10:00 a.m.
