Attorney Dennis L. Voght was present and stated he was a member of the Board of the El Dorado Boys Home, Inc., and that the Planning Commission had failed to articulate for their benefit what the planning basis was for its decision, and that before proceeding further in the matter he would request that the Planning Commission clarify in writing the findings of fact which led to its decision.

County Counsel advised that to his knowledge there was no legal code which requires findings of fact on an Appeal; and this request was inappropriate since no request had been made at the Planning Commission hearing.

Mr. Voght further stated that he did not feel they should be treated any differently than any family with teenage children, and if having them located there would be injurious to the health, safety and welfare of the neighborhood, then they would require the Board to so state. Mr. Voght presented his paper on the subject to the Board Clerk. (Exhibit A)

Attorney Patrick J. Riley was present and stated that he would like to offer into evidence all of the writings, documents, and maps which were presented at the Hearingsbefore the Planning Commission by both the applicant and the opponents.

Mr. Clay Dieckmann, Citizens Planning Advisory Committee for American Flat, Spanish Flat and Bear Creek area, was present and presented a map outlining the proposed zoning, and depicting the proximity of the property owners living in the area and opposed to the Boys Home - Exhibit I. Mr. Dieckmann stated their concern over the possible encroachment of an unrelated use to the homogeneous development of the area. Mr. Dieckmann presented his paper on the matter to the Board Clerk (Exhibit I).

Mr. Robert Greenwood, member of Citizens Advisory Planning Committee for Spanish Flat, Bear Creek, and American Flat was present and stated his opposition to the proposed use of the area by the Home as being an unrelated use. Mr. Greenwood presented his paper on the matter to the Board Clerk - (Exhibit II).

Mrs. Maybelle Timm of Kelsey was present and spoke for the neighbors in the immediate area of the Boys Home who are in opposition to the granting of a Special Use Permit to the Boys Home, on the grounds that the safety, peace, and tranquility of the people now living in the area could be jeopardized. Mrs. Timm presented her paper on the matter to the Board Clerk - (Exhibit III).

Attorney Patrick J. Riley in rebuttal to a statement made earlier by Attorney Dennis Voght that the Commission used the zoning ordinance to conceal racial, economic and cultural discrimination, stated that at no time during any planning hearing was any element of race, religion, or ethnic origin brought out by any of the opponents of the Boys Home.

The Chairman closed the public hearing.

At the recommendation of County Counsel, the Chairman ordered all evidence, minutes, and files of the Planning Commission on the subject into the Board's records, and on motion of Supervisor Lawyer, seconded by Supervisor Caswell, and unanimously carried, the decision on the matter was continued to December 21, 1971, at 2:00 p.m.

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On motion of Supervisor Lawyer, seconded by Supervisor Caswell, and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Caswell, Goodloe, Lawyer, and Stewart; No: Supervisor Johnson, the Board waived the one year law enforcement experience requirement for the Supervising Sheriff's Clerk position in the Sheriff's Office, and authorized the Regular Help appointment of Darlene Annette Sharpe as Supervising Sheriff's Clerk, at Range 35, Step 1, effective December 15, 1971.

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At the recommendation of the County Counsel, on motion of Supervisor Stewart, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried, the Auditor was authorized and directed to proceed with the transfer of monies held on time deposit 0-265 at the Bank of America, Placerville, for deposit in escrow before December 24, 1971, for the purchase of the County Office Center Building for the sum of \$126,556.92.

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On motion of Supervisor Stewart, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried, the Board authorized payment of \$990.00 to W. E. Tooker, owner of Lake Tahoe Ambulance, for services provided in the matter of eleven cases outlined by the County Administrator, and the Welfare Department was directed to study the remaining names, trips, and circumstances for subsequent determination by County Counsel as to the County's responsibility for additional sums requested by Lake Tahoe Ambulance.

Johannsen; Bruce B. Bonnello; and Norma Huff. All are effective December 20, 1971.
