GENERAL ORDERS

Mrs. J. K. Schlappi, Secretary of Friends of the Hospital Committee presented a petition containing approximately 6200 signatures requesting that the Board do whatever necessary to keep the Community Hospital accredited and operating. Mrs. Schlappi also submitted a 3-page letter to the Board listing 10 courses of action; one of which is to hire a well qualified firm of hospital consultants to do a competent study of the future utilization of the Hospital -- cost of hiring said consultants to be in the neighborhood of between \$10,000.00 and \$40,000.00.

Also, on the Agenda and for Board consideration was a letter from El Dorado Comprehensive Health Planning Council requesting that the Board defer any plans for closure of the Community Hospital for a period of six months during which time an independent firm of hospital consultants be hired to do an in-depth study of the best utilization of the facility.

No formal action was taken by the Board; however, the Board did state their intention to meet on Monday, March 27, 1972, at 10:00 a.m. as the Board of Trustees of the Community Hospital, in the Board of Supervisors Chambers, at which time various proposals would be considered in more detail regarding the disposition of the Community Hospital.

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A report was submitted by the Assessor, County Counsel, Chief Building Inspector, Planning, and State Department of Housing and Community Development regarding the Ad Hoc Mobilehome Committee report which suggested, in an effort to balance the tax inequity between a conventional home and a mobilehome, that mobilehomes be placed as improved property structures on foundations acceptable to the County Building Department by means of a detachable arrangement such as a turnbuckle and concrete piers: to still be within the Title 25 requirements of Health & Safety Code; said turnbuckle allowing the unit to become mobile and thereby it could not be interpreted as "permanently attached". The combined report by the Assessor, County Counsel, and others heretofore mentioned, arrived at the following conclusion: "The County does not need an ordinance which allows mobilehomes which are constructed to meet the Uniform Building Code, to be placed in any area where a conventional home is allowed, because the County has no restrictions against placing modular housing, or mobilehomes placed on foundations, under our present laws. To allow Chapter 4 of Title 25, Health & Safety Code, to be an alternative to the Building Code would be a futile act at present because it would create substandard housing which would not be allowable under State law." (Continued)

On motion of Supervisor Lawyer, seconded by Supervisor Caswell, and unanimously carried, the contract with G. H. Lang, M.D. for professional services in the field of orthopedic surgery at El Dorado Community Hospital, was approved, and the Chairman was authorized to sign.
