- Approval of construction drawings and specifications by Director of Public Works prior to proceeding with any subdivision work;
- 2. Completion of road improvements, lot accesses, drainage systems and water systems, sewer system and setting of final monuments in accordance with requirements of the Department of Public Works, Health Department, County Surveyor and the El Dorado County Subdivision Ordinance or execution of an agreement to install these improvements and monuments secured by bond or cash deposit;
- Use of lots subject to future County Planning Commission variance approval for less lot area and less side yard setbacks;
- 4. Subject to filing of Declaration of Restrictions and Articles of Incorporation of the Homeowners' Association for maintenance of the driveways, parking areas and open spaces.

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At the recommendation of the Planning Commission, on motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Caswell, and unanimously carried, the Tentative Map of Sleepy Hollow, Map No. 2 (A Rural Subdivision); Subdivider: Steve Williams, etal; 96 lots; Rescue area, was approved subject to the following conditions: (Continued)

- Completion of road improvements, drainage systems, water systems, and setting of final monuments in accordance with requirements of the regulations for rural subdivisions or execution of an agreement to install these improvements and monuments secured by bond or cash deposit;
- Provision of lots adequate for individual sewage disposal in accordance with the requirements of the Health Department;
- Use of lots subject to developer petitioning for appropriate rezoning;
- 4. Subject to the applicable provisions of Article 8, Rural Subdivisions contained in the El Dorado County Subdivision Ordinance and compliance with Resolution No. 513-68 requiring establishment of a Landowners' Association for maintenance of the roads and common owned areas within the subdivision;
- 5. Subject to the requirements of the El Dorado County Office of Civil Defense as contained in their letter of April 12, 1972;
- 6. Subject to the requirements of the California Division of Forestry as contained in their letter of March 30, 1972.

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At the recommendation of the Planning Director, on motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried, the Agreement with Angeles Capital Company to make subdivision improvements in Sierra Springs Unit No. 7 Subdivision was approved and the Chairman authorized to sign; and a bond in the amount of \$314,783.75 having been furnished in accordance with said Agreement, the Final Map of Sierra Springs Unit No. 7 Subdivision was approved and the Clerk authorized to endorse such approval on said Final Map.

Letter received from Director of Public Works recommending that a load limit be established on the full length of Newtown Road from Pleasant Valley northwesterly to Broadway near the Placerville city limits, due to the deterioration of this road by heavy logging trucks, and further recommending that the limit be established at seventeen tons per vehicle.

SETTING LOAD LIMIT ON NEWTOWN ROAD

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Board discussed the matter of transportation by the Sheriff's Department of mental patients who are transferred from Barton Memorial Hospital, South Lake Tahoe, to Community Hospital. An area of misunderstanding by the Sheriff existed relating to the Board's response on April 4, 1972, to the Sheriff's request for clarification of the responsibility and related costs for transportation of individuals to the Community Hospital by the Sheriff's Office, who are then referred to the Stockton State Hospital for inpatient services. The Board, at that time, referred the matter to the County Administrative Office for determination as to feasibility of utilizing a Probation Department employee to transport these patients to Stockton, and the Sheriff's Department was to be so notified that it was not the responsibility of his department to transport these patients to Stockton. The Board explained that this in no way referred to the transportation of patients from Barton Memorial to Community.

On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Caswell, and unanimously carried, the Sheriff was directed to continue to transport mental patients, when necessary, from Barton Memorial Hospital, South Lake Tahoe, to Community Hospital, Placerville.

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On motion of Supervisor Caswell, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and unanimously carried, the extra help appointment, retroactive to February 1, 1972, was approved for Frances Guistina, as Bailiff, Range 39, Step 1, for Lake Valley Justice Court, South Lake Tahoe.

Supervisor Stewart departed

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On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Goodloe, and unanimously carried by those present, the Administrative Analyst was directed to investigate the reason why posting of accounts at the Community Hospital has not been kept current, and report back to the Board on May 2, 1972.

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On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Caswell, and unanimously carried by those present, the Chairman was authorized to sign the Agreement with Gil Construction Company for construction of the El Dorado County Sheriff and Court Facility at South Lake Tahoe.

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On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Caswell, and unanimously carried by those present, the Purchasing Agent was authorized to bind the County for the insurance required in the bid specifications for the El Dorado County Sheriff and Court Facility at South Lake Tahoe.

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There being no further business, the Board adjourned to Tuesday, May 2, 1972, at 2:00 p.m.
