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Welfare Director submitted a request for relief of responsibility from Patrick McPeters for the support of his father, H. L. McPeters, and recommending denial of said request on the grounds that there is not sufficient proof to satisfy the Code requirements.

On motion of Supervisor Stewart, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and unanimously carried by those present, the matter was referred to the Board's Administration Committee to establish a procedure for handling the requests as they come from the Welfare Department, and as an aid to the Board in their determinations on the requests.
