The Board convened this date in continued meeting which had been regularly scheduled for September 5, and continued due to lack of quorum. Present: Supervisors William V. D. Johnson, Thomas M. Goodloe Jr., Raymond E. Lawyer and Thomas L. Stewart. Also present: Connie A. Peterson, Deputy Clerk to the Board. Supervisor John M. Caswell arrived late. Chairman Johnson presided.

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The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was led by Supervisor Stewart.

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On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present, the Agenda was adopted.

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On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Goodloe, Stewart and Johnson; Abstain: Supervisor Lawyer; Absent: Supervisor Caswell, the minutes of August 22, 1972 were approved as submitted.

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The draft of Negative Declaration of Environmental Impact on Green Valley Road Reconstruction Project submitted by the Director of Public Works, was informally continued to September 12, 1972.

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The Director of Public Works submitted Change Order No. 7 to contract with Gil Construction Company for the El Dorado County Sheriff and Court facility at South Lake Tahoe, decreasing contract price in amount of \$575; change replaces an open grille vehicle entrance door with a solid panel door.

On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and unanimously carried by those present, Change Order No. 7 was approved as submitted.

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At the recommendation of the Welfare Director, on motion of Supervisor Lawyer, seconded by Supervisor Goodloe, and unanimously carried by those present, Mr. Alvin E. Shively was relieved of the financial support of his father, pursuant to Civil Code Section 206.7, and Mr. Joseph S. Neal was relieved of the financial support of his father.

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The El Dorado County Health and Medical Director submitted a request for authorization to purchase equipment that would enable the Health Department to provide Family Planning Clinic services and employee physicals, and advised that the total cost of equipment, \$796.56, is available through the OEO Family Planning Grant. On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and unanimously carried by those present, the request to purchase equipment was approved.

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On motion of Supervisor Lawyer, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present, the following budget transfer was approved:

At the recommendation of the Purchasing Agent, on motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer and unanimously carried by those present, the Board approved that the County discontinue leasing from Empire Gas Company a portion of the rear parking lot at the County Office Center, 2850 Cold Springs Road, Placerville; present lease between Unigas (purchased by Empire Gas Co.) and the County expires on October 1, 1972.

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Letter submitted by the County Surveyor stating that survey monuments for the following subdivisions have been set in conformance with the Subdivision Ordinance, and recommending that the following bonds and cash deposit be released to the respective subdividers:

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and unanimously carried by those present, the above-numbered bonds and cash deposit were released as recommended.

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The Assistant County Counsel submitted recommendation that a letter be sent to Outingdale Improvement Club stating that the County has no interest in any lands or improvements in Outingdale Subdivision No. 1, with the exception of 0.17 mile of Vacation Boulevard which the County maintains.

The motion of Supervisor Goodloe that a letter be sent to Outingdale Improvement Club in accordance with the recommendation of the Assistant County Counsel was seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried by those present.

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The Purchasing Agent submitted specifications for Bid No. 411 - 1972

Model Four-Wheel Drive Vehicles for the Sheriff's Department and authorization to advertise bid opening for September 25, 1972, with award by the Board on or after October 3, 1972. On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and unanimously carried by those present the specifications were approved as submitted and the Purchasing Agent authorized to advertise for bids as requested.

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Executive Director, Community Action Council, submitted Addendum to contract between County of El Dorado and the City of South Lake Tahoe, dated February 10, 1972, for Agreement No. EEA 06-606 on Grant No. EEA 062-6105, increasing funds in amount of \$2,250 and Addendum to contract between the County of El Dorado and El Dorado Irrigation District, dated February 8, 1972, for Agreement No. EEA 06-606 on Grant No. EEA 062-6105, increasing funds in amount of \$1,750, and requested that Chairman be authorized to sign said Addenda. On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present, the Addenda were approved and the Chairman authorized to sign.

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In a verbal report the County Administrative Officer outlined the steps to be taken by the Health, Building and Planning Departments beginning on September 13, 1972, regarding the trailer problem at Shoo Fly Ridge. Representatives from the three departments will inspect the problem areas, write up any violations, which will then be sent to the District Attorney's office by September 18. The District Attorney will notify, by letter, those persons cited and advise that they will have a certain number of days to correct violations or they will be prosecuted.

The County Health and Medical Director was informally requested to make a progress report to the Board regarding the above matter on September 19, 1972.

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Supervisor Caswell arrived.

Supervisor Goodloe gave a verbal report and presented photographs regarding request received from property owners on Lone Star Court, Deer Park Unit No. 1, as to whether or not the improvements they have made on a certain slope easement are encroachments on County property. (Referred on August 29, 1972.) Supervisor Goodloe advised that improvements involved included two retaining walls and a picket fence.

After discussion was held, on motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and unanimously carried, the Public Works Director was requested to issue encroachment permits, and any fees to be waived, to those owners of existing homes where retaining walls (picket fence) have been constructed on slope easement on Lone Star Court cul-de-sac in Deer Park Unit No. 1, with the provision that the height of retaining walls (picket fence) is not to exceed the elevation of the top of cut.

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On motion of Supervisor Caswell, seconded by Supervisor Goodloe, and unanimously carried, the Chairman was authorized to sign the Agreement between the County of El Dorado and the City of Placerville for construction of certain street and road improvements on Cold Springs Road; City of Placerville to deposit with the County estimated expenses in the amount of \$4,850 for their portion of the project.

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Bid openings held on August 28, 1972 for the following: Bid No. 394, Furnish and Install One Snowplow for Public Works Department, and bids were submitted by Transport Supply, West Sacramento and Wahl & Borg Enterprises, South Lake Tahoe; Bid No. 395, Wacker Vibrator Compactor for Public Works Department, and bids were submitted by George M. Philpott Co., Inc., Sacramento; Edward R. Bacon Co., Sacramento; George's Contractors & Industrial Supply, Sacramento. (Original bids on file in the Board of Supervisors' Office.)

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and unanimously carried, Bid No. 394, Furnish and Install One Snowplow was awarded to Wahl & Borg Enterprises, South Lake Tahoe, and Bid No. 395, Compactor for Public Works Department was awarded to George M. Philpott Co., Inc., Sacramento.

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Communication received from the El Dorado County Chamber of Commerce requesting that a member of the Board of Supervisors be appointed to serve on a steering committee that is being established to plan and coordinate a campaign to determine the support for natural gas in El Dorado County.

On motion of Supervisor Lawyer, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Caswell, Lawyer, Stewart and Johnson; Abstain: Supervisor Goodloe, the Board appointed Supervisor Caswell to the committee as requested.

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Communication received from the Golden Chain Council of the Mother Lode, Inc., requesting County's support in the amount of \$150 for dues and \$400 for the purchase of Golden Chain Highway 49 maps; and also requesting that the Board advise if any changes are desired in the County's list of Directors for the next year.

On motion of Supervisor Caswell, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Caswell, Lawyer, Stewart and Johnson; Abstain: Supervisor Goodloe, the Board approved request for \$150 dues and \$400 for maps, with money to be paid from the Chamber of Commerce budget, and no changes were requested in the County's list of Directors. 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On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and unanimously carried, the Annual Audit dated June 30, 1972 submitted by Tahoe Regional Planning Agency was placed on file in the Board of Supervisors' office.

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Forest Supervisor, Eldorado National Forest, submitted statement concerning use of roads on National Forest land and requested that the County not consider a road on National Forest land as constituting adequate access to a subdivision, or land division, unless such road is a part of a public road agency road system, the landowner has obtained a right of way from the Forest Service, or other satisfactory arrangements with the Forest Service have been made.

On motion of Supervisor Lawyer, seconded by Supervisor Goodloe, and unanimously carried, this matter was referred to the Planning Commission for study and report back to the Board.

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Communication received from the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Lahontan Region, advising that a meeting has been tentatively set for October 12, 1972, in the Tahoe Basin to discuss Lake Tahoe Basin Siltation, and requesting that the Board appoint County representatives to attend.

On motion of Supervisor Caswell, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and unanimously carried, the Public Works Director, County Counsel, Director of Environmental Health, Planning Director and Supervisor Stewart were appointed to attend the meeting in the Tahoe Basin, and they were further requested to prepare a report on the subjects contained in the letter from the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, to be brought back to the Board of Supervisors for approval prior to submission to the Water Quality Control Board.

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The report by the Board of Supervisors' Administrative Committee regarding State Cooperative Personnel Study of Community Action Council employees was informally continued to September 12, 1972, at 2:30 p.m. (Referred 8/29/72)

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On motion of Supervisor Caswell, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Caswell, Lawyer and Stewart; Noes: Supervisors Goodloe and Johnson, the County Administrative Officer and the Public Works Director were appointed to serve on the Sacramento Regional Area Planning Commission Committee for Water and Waste Management.

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There being no further business, the Board adjourned to Tuesday, September 12, 1972, at 10:00 a.m.
