STATE OF CALIFORNIA, COUNTY OF EL DORADO BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES September 19, 1972

The Board convened in regular meeting. Present: Supervisors John M. Caswell, William V. D. Johnson, Thomas M. Goodloe, Jr., Raymond E. Lawyer, and Thomas L. Stewart. Also present: Ann R. Macy, Board of Supervisors Clerk. Chairman Johnson presided.

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The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was led by Supervisor Stewart.

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The Invocation was offered by Reverend Walter P. Brock, El Dorado Community Church.

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The Agenda was adopted on motion of Supervisor Lawyer, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried.

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The Minutes of September 11, 1972, and September 12, 1972, were approved as submitted, on motion of Supervisor Stewart, seconded by Supervisor Caswell, and unanimously carried.

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On motion of Supervisor Lawyer, seconded by Supervisor Caswell, and unanimously carried, the Warrant Register Claims for El Dorado County and the Claims as submitted by the Community Action Council were approved for payment with the provision that Claims will be held for review by the Board members until 5:00 p.m. this date; any claims not then approved may be withdrawn and held until following week.

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On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Caswell, and unanimously carried, all personnel matters submitted by the County Administrative Officer were approved as recommended by him, with the exception of the appointment of two part-time student trainees for the Sheriff's Office, which were approved subject to the Sheriff being able to provide within his own budget for their salaries. (The list of Personnel Matters dated September 19, 1972, is on file in the Board of Supervisors Office).

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District Attorney submitted letter requesting authorization to destroy inactive misdemeanor files three or more years old, pursuant to Government Code Section 26202.

On motion of Supervisor Stewart, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and unanimously carried, the request was approved.

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Director of Public Works submitted Change Order No. 4 to Gil Construction contract for the Sheriff and Court Facility, South Lake Tahoe, which replaces Alternate H of the original bid; making the County's share \$1,681.50 rather than \$2,610.00.

On motion of Supervisor Stewart, seconded by Supervisor Goodloe, and unanimously carried, the Chairman was authorized to sign Change Order No. 4.

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Department of Public Works, Right of Way Division, submitted request that the Chairman be authorized to sign Certificate of Acceptance from John R. Hunt, etux, for slope easement on Ridgeview Village Unit No. 1.

On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and unanimously carried, the Chairman was authorized to sign Certificate of Acceptance of Grant of Easement.

Airports Director submitted letter stating that the Georgetown Airport Runway Project, FAAP No. 7-06-0093-02-72, Strengthening and Paving of Runway 16-34 and Paving of Apron Taxiway, and recommending that the Chairman be authorized to sign Notice of Completion.

On motion of Supervisor Lawyer, seconded by Supervisor Caswell, and unanimously carried, the Chairman was authorized to sign Notice of Completion.

Purchasing Agent submitted letter requesting approval to purchase through the Superintendent of Schools, one 16 MM Projector, as budgeted in the Service Unit. (Continued from 9/12/72)

On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Caswell, and unanimously carried, the request was denied, and the Purchasing Agent was instructed to transfer the surplus projector from the Public Works Department to the Service Unit.

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Health and Medical Director submitted a report stating that representatives of the Health Department, Building Department, and Assessor's Office visited the Shoo Fly Ridge Area on September 13, 14, and 15, and that 14 different violators have been referred to the District Attorney's Office. The report listed the following health violations:

- 1. Abandoned mine shafts 2. Illegal privies 4 3. Illegal or non-existent water and/or sewage system
- 4. Abandoned vehicles 1
- 5. Illegal garbage dump

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The report further stated that citations are being compiled and will be referred to the District Attorney's Office by September 22, 1972.

On motion of Supervisor Lawyer, seconded by Supervisor Goodloe, and unanimously carried, the report was placed on file, and the matter continued to September 26, 1972.

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On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried, the Chairman was authorized to sign the Lease between the County and Robert H. Baglin for that property and building located at 3951 Placerville Drive housing the District Attorney's Office, wherein the County will pay \$350.00 per month for a period of two years.

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On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Caswell, and unanimously carried, the Board referred the Agreement between the County and the City of South Lake Tahoe for services requested by the Lake Valley Justice Court for the collection of fines relating to Vehicle Violations, to the County Auditor and County Counsel for a report and recommendation, and the matter was continued to October 3, 1972.

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The Board considered a Lease with Option between the County and Donald D. Wright and E.&M. Investment Company for use of Storage Garage located in Tahoma at a rate of \$375.00 for a period of ten years; with option to purchase after that time at a price of \$39,750.00, or continue to lease at a rate of \$450.00 per month.

On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Caswell, and unanimously carried, the Board appointed Supervisor Stewart to meet with the Director of Public Works and Mr. Marr (of E.&M. Investment) to bring back to the Board a workable proposition.

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Director of Public Works submitted letter requesting that the Chairman be authorized to sign an Agreement with Pacific Gas and Electric Company wherein the County will lease vault space at Pine Hill for the installation of transmitters for Sheriff's Department and Public Works at an annual rate of \$560.00, to terminate April 30, 1975.

On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried, the Agreement was approved, and the Chairman authorized to sign after changes proposed by County Counsel have been made.

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On motion of Supervisor Caswell, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried, the Chairman was authorized to sign Memorandum of Agreement between the El Dorado County Negotiating Committee and the Employees Association Negotiating Committee. (Continued from August 29, 1972)

At the recommendation of the Planning Commission, on motion of Supervisor Caswell, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and unanimously carried, the Tentative Map of Zee Estates (Rural Subdivision); Subdivider, Zee Enterprises, Inc., Folsom Reservoir area, 23 Single Family Two Acre Residential lots, was approved subject to the following conditions:

- Completion of road improvements, drainage systems and setting of final monuments in accordance with requirements of the regulations for rural subdivisions or execution of an agreement to install these improvements and monuments secured by bond or cash deposit;
- Provision of lots adequate for individual sewage disposal in accordance with the requirements of the Health Department;
- 3. Subject to the applicable providions of Article 8, Rural Subdivisions, contained in the El Dorado County Subdivision Ordinance and compliance with Resolution No. 513-68 requiring establishment of a Landowners' Association for maintenance of the roads within the subdivision;
- 4. Prior to filing a final map, subject to either a letter from the owner stating that a road right-of-way will be provided through the NAPOTS lot on the south to Salmon Falls Road or if the property is sold, that the right-of-way will be established.
- 5. Subject to obtaining a fire escape route through the E. C. Fleming property on the north to connect with Salmon Falls Road prior to filing the final map.

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Planning Commission submitted letter recommending a one year extension to September 28, 1973, on Tentative Map of Sierra Springs Unit A, Rural Subdivision, and that the Board approve two conditions in addition to those originally approved with the tentative map, as follows:

- Subject to driveway access being constructed by the developer on all lots with a cut or fill along the street frontage in excess of 6 feet in height;
- Subject to a soil and erosion control plan being prepared by a registered civil engineer and incorporated in the construction plans. (Continued)

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On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and unanimously carried, the subdividers' request for one year extension, as recommended by the Planning Commission, was approved, subject to the two additional conditions heretofore mentioned.

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On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and unanimously carried, the Board referred to the Traffic Advisory Committee a request to have a speed limit reduced from 45 MPH to a safer speed limit of 30 MPH on Pleasant Valley Road -- Highway 49 intersection, approximately 3/4 mile east of Pleasant Valley Road.

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Supervisor Caswell departed

On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board adopted the Rebuttal Argument to the Sheriff's Salary Initiative to appear with the November ballot, and all Board members were authorized to sign the Rebuttal after the Chairman of the Board and the County Administrative Officer have agreed on certain changes in the language to make it more explicit.

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Supervisor Caswell returned

Ford McCoy, Advertising Chairman, Chamber of Commerce, was present and stated that there was a trememdous demand for the El Dorado County maps and that to date, since the end of June, 1972, when 10,000 of the new maps were received, over 9,000 have been distributed. Mr. McCoy asked for Board authorization for the purchase of more maps.

On motion of Supervisor Stewart, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Caswell, Lawyer, Stewart, and Johnson; No: Supervisor Goodloe, the Board authorized the purchase of 20,000 maps, with funds to come from Board of Supervisors budget: Special Departmental Expense (82-2230), in the amount of \$2,357.10.

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A 2:30 Time Slot was allotted for representatives of the State Department of Social Welfare to discuss the proposed Eligibility and Grant Determination Contract. (On July 11, 1972, the Board Clerk was directed to request comments from Assemblyman Eugene Chappie and Senator Stephen Teale as to the reasons why the Counties are being asked to enter this contract, and the advantages accruing to the various Counties in entering the contract -- and at the same time the Clerk was further directed to request from the State Director of Social Welfare additional explanation and clarification of his letter which accompanied said contract.)

Despite having received a letter dated September 5, 1972, acknowledging that there would be representatives from the State Department of Social Welfare -- no one showed up at the meeting, and the Board, consequently, took no action. --//--

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BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES September 19, 1972

Board considered the El Dorado County Community Action Council Classification and Salary Survey as prepared by the Cooperative Personnel Services, California State Personnel Board, together with a Salary Cost Analysis consisting of two proposals; one with a 7-1/2% maximum pay differential (Proposal No. 1), and the other as proposed by the State Personnel Board (Proposal No. 2) consisting of a percentage differential of up to 20%.

On motion of Supervisor Caswell, seconded by Supervisor Goodloe, and unanimously carried, the Board accepted and approved of Proposal No. 1 of the Salary Cost Analysis, including the Executive Director at 7-1/2%.

On motion of Supervisor Goodloe, seconded by Supervisor Caswell, and unanimously carried, the Board authorized the pay increases to be retroactive to July 8, 1972, subject to Federal OEO approval.

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Caswell, and unanimously carried, the Classification and Salary Survey was accepted and referred to the County Administrative Officer for review and report back to the Board.

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Board considered a proposal to hire a Director of Economic Development for the purpose of attempting to entice more industry into the County. They also considered recommendations made by the County Administrative Officer of a procedure to follow if the Board should decide to employ a professional Economic Development Director.

The motion of Supervisor Stewart, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, to proceed to employ an Economic Development Director, as outlined by the County Administrative Officer, was amended by Supervisor Goodloe and seconded by Supervisor Caswell , to continue the matter until October 17, 1972.

The Chairman called for the vote on the amendment to the motion, and the amendment lost by reason of the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Caswell and Goodloe; Noes: Supervisors Lawyer, Stewart, and Johnson.
