The Board convened in regular meeting. Present: Supervisors Franklin K. Lane, W. P. Walker, Raymond E. Lawyer, and Thomas L. Stewart. Absent: Supervisor William V. D. Johnson. Also present: Ann R. Macy, Board of Supervisors Clerk. Chairman Lawyer presided for the morning session. First Vice Chairman Stewart presided at the afternoon session, in the absence of the Chairman.

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The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was led by Supervisor Stewart.

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The Invocation was offered by Reverend Harvey Hood, Presbyterian Church.

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On motion of Supervisor Lane, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present, the Agenda was adopted after being amended as follows: (1) Addition of an emergency Ordinance relating to terms of office of Commissions and Committee members, and request for approval of letters to be sent to outgoing Committee and Commission members, to be considered after the Agenda is adopted; (2) Postponment of one week of Item Cl, Page 3, regarding Exercise Yard at the County Jail Facility; (3) Addition of a report by Supervisor Stewart to Page 3, as Item 8; (4) Postponement of one week for Item El, Page 4, regarding approval of specifications for Bid Nos. 459 and 460; (5) Addition of request for funds by County Administrative Officer for study of the Data Processing Department, and funds for increased advertising costs of the Local Agency Formation Commission, to be added to Personnel matters.

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The Minutes of January 5, 1973, and January 16, 1973, were approved as submitted, on motion of Supervisor Stewart, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and unanimously carried by those present.

(In response to a request from the Press, Supervisor Stewart stated that his report was considered "priviledged information" and a copy could not be released to the Press until such time as the District Attorney had reported back to the Board on the subject.)

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Supervisor Lane read a statement relating to the dismissal of the Director of Public Works by the 1972 Board of Supervisors.

At the conclusion of his statement, Supervisor Lane moved that G. Arthur Cort be reinstated as the Director of Public Works effective January 5, 1973, under the following conditions:

- 1. That he serve a 180-day probationary period for the purpose of assuring the Board that those corrective measures necessary are taken;
- That should substantial non-compliance or non-accomplishment be witnessed, his resignation shall be forthcoming;
- That the County is cleared of all pending suits, or any suit that may evolve from the previous hearing action.

Supervisor Walker seconded the motion, and it was carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Lane, Walker, and Lawyer; No: Supervisor Stewart; Absent: Supervisor Johnson.

The Board informally set an Executive Session with Mr. Cort for Monday, January 29, 1973, at 2:00 p.m. regarding his relationship to the job; i.e. how the Board will evaluate him in regard to his duties and performance of those duties.
