NB 629567, in amounts of \$71,190.00 each, issued by the Home Insurance Company be released; and Maintenance Bond No. NB 629567-A, The Home Insurance Company, be accepted to guarantee workmanship and materials for a period of one year. On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried, the recommendations of the Director of Public Works were approved as submitted, and the Chairman authorized to sign Notice of Completion.

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Letter submitted by the County Fair Manager, stating that paving and grading project at the County Fairgrounds has been completed by the contractor, Joe Vicini, Inc., and recommending that Notice of Completion be executed and filed with the County Recorder; Labor and Materials Bond and Performance Bond Nos 69-0120-7518-73, in amount of \$19,805.00 each be released, and further requesting that Board approve additions to the contract totaling \$1,485.06. On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried, request approved as submitted, and Chairman authorized to sign Notice of Completion.

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On motion of Supervisor Lane, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried, consideration of the Gold Rush Parkway Plan was continued to September 25, 1973.

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Deputy Director, El Dorado County Community Action Council, Inc., submitted for Board approval, a revised budget for OEO Program Accounts Ol, Conduct and Administration and O5, Community Programs, stating that revisions are necessary due to definite Grant Action from OEO, approved by the Board on July 17, 1973, further advising that Meals On Wheels Program expenditures as proposed have been incorporated into the O5 Account Budget. On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Lane, and unanimously carried the revised budget was approved as submitted.

Deputy Director, Community Action Council, Inc., submitted a letter advising that on June 26, the County approved Novation Agreements transferring Department of Labor Programs to the County and the County then delegated administrative duties under said contracts to the Council by Agreement, further that administrative functions include monthly preparation of invoices and from time-to-time modifications of these agreements are necessary. He further stated that since the effective date of the Novation Agreements the Vice-Chairman Mr. Thomas L. Stewart and the County Administrative Officer, Mr. Claud T. Smith, have been signing the documents mentioned. Since the Board did not take official action authorizing these signatures request is being made at this time to adopt retroactively and prospectively the signatures of the Vice Chairman and County Administrative Officer for the purpose of signing necessary documents.

On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Lane, and unanimously carried, the Board directed that Community Action Council Executive Director Mr. Robert Amburn, or, in his absence, Deputy Director James Anderson, Jr., be authorized to sign monthly reports relating to Department of Labor Programs, however any modifications to agreements are to be submitted to the Board of Supervisors for approval and for signing by the Chairman or the Vice-Chairman of the Board.

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In response to a letter from John R. Loeffler and others, who have aircraft based at the Lake Tahoe Airport, on July 31, 1973 the Airports Director was requested to submit a report on this date from the General Recreation Corporation of America, developers of a recreational area (campground) that is being constructed between Kyburz Road and the Airport, as to whether they contemplate providing fencing around the campsite to prevent children from straying close to aircraft.

Airports Director submitted a memorandum requesting a two week delay for response, because the site plan submitted does not specify the type of fencing between the Airport and the campground, and a request has been submitted to the Planning Director for extension to the present Special Use Permit by the Corporation, and in the Planning Director's response it is intended to include as an added requirement, the construction of a six foot solid fence, which should satisfy the concerned aviator group.

On motion of Supervisor Stewart, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and unanimously carried this item was continued to August 28, 1973.

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County Counsel submitted a report regarding the legal aspects of a proposed ordinance granting Veterans preference points for County employment and also regarding the possibility of a preference for El Dorado County citizens.

County Counsel reported that he and the Veterans Service Officer were unable to locate any authority for a veterans preference in the Military and Veterans Code, however the proposed veterans preference could be included in the ordinance code for the reason that it is in the public interest, further that he and the Veterans Service Officer were doubtful that any discrimination based on place of enlistment could be upheld. On the question of preference for County residents, veteran or not, he stated that the courts have not upheld residency requirements that aren't reasonably related to the purpose of residency (e. g., Welfare and Election laws), therefore as soon as a person moved to this County with the intention of making this his home he would be considered a resident, and the only advantage would then be for those applicants presently living in El Dorado County.

On motion of Supervisor Lane, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried, the item was referred back to the County Counsel for further research on El Dorado County residents' preference, and also on Veterans having been El Dorado County residents at time of entering the armed services.

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On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried by those present, the Chairman was authorized to sign Change Order No. 2, confirming Field Orders 1, 2 and 3, to Contract with A. P. West Construction Company for County Historical Museum, increasing the contract amount by \$1,909.06. (Field Order No. 1-\$448.50; No. 2-\$322.56; No. 3-\$1,138.00)

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On motion of Supervisor Stewart, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried, the Chairman was authorized to sign an Agreement with Earl Marr, dba Westshore Realty, after occupancy date in Paragraph 3 is changed from November 1, 1973 to November 15, 1973; said agreement provides that Westshore agrees to construct a storage facility building 32' x 36', and upon completion the County shall purchase the real property and improvements for a total purchase price of \$45,500.00. 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At the recommendation of the Planning Commission, on motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Lane, and unanimously carried, the tentative map of Cameron Park South, Unit No. 4, a Rural Subdivision, was approved subject to the following conditions: (continued)

- Completion of road improvements, drainage systems, water systems and setting of final monuments in accordance with requirements of the regulations for Rural Subdivisions or execution of an agreement to install these improvements and monuments secured by bond or cash deposit;
- Provision of lots adequate for individual sewage disposal in accordance with the requirements of the Health Department;
- 3. Subject to the requirements of the Department of Public Works as contained in their letter of June 25, 1973;
- 4. Subject to the applicable provisions of Article 8, Rural Subdivisions as contained in the El Dorado County Subdivision Ordinance and compliance with Resolution No. 513-68 requiring annexation to or contracting with the Cameron Estates Community Service District or establishment of a landowners' association for maintenance of the roads with the exception that the roads are not dedicated to public use except that access cannot be denied to all public service entities requiring access to the area, such as Health and Building inspectors, Animal Control, Fire Protection, public utility maintenance, garbage collectors, etc;
- 5. Subject to a 10' non-vehicular access easement along the northerly property line of lots 1, 4 and 6 which front on Crazy Horse Way;
- 6. Environmental Impact Statement accepted as recommended for approval by the Review Committee.

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The Planning Commission and the Agricultural Commission were requested to report on this date to the Board on their recommendations regarding the County's Land Conservation Act Contract and present Exclusive Agricultural zoning. (Referred 7/17/73 and continued from 8/7/73)

The Planning Commission submitted recommendations for changes in the regulations for the AE zone, however since the Agricultural Commission did not have the opportunity to go over Plannings' recommendations, this item was continued to August 28, 1973, and referred back to Planning Commission and Agricultural Commission jointly, for further study and recommendations, on motion of Supervisor Lane, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried.

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Chairman, Agricultural Commission, submitted a communication stating that at the present time there are lands in the County that are zoned Exclusive Agricultural but are not under the land conservation act contract, and that confusion exists among the landowners concerning this situation, therefore the Commission is recommending to the Board that all lands under AE zoning not under the land conservation act contract be removed from AE zoning.
