BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES October 22, 1974

The Board convened in regular meeting. Present: Supervisors Franklin K. Lane, William V. D. Johnson, W. P. Walker, and Raymond E. Lawyer. Absent: Supervisor Thomas L. Stewart. Ann R. Macy, Board of Supervisors Clerk was also present. Vice Chairman Walker presided.

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The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was led by Supervisor Lane.

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On motion of Supervisor Lane, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried by those present, the Agenda was adopted with the exception of Item 18 which was continued to November 12, 1974 (Request of a taxpayer for a discussion concerning the manner the Tax Collector notifies taxpayers who are in arrears); and the Board declared their intent to hold an Executive Session regarding the purchase of the Oetting (Hildman site) property; and the Board also approved the New Business Agenda, assigning an 11:45 a.m. Time Allocation to meet as the Board of Equalization to consider two requests for rescheduling of Equalization Hearings.

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On motion of Supervisor Lane, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and unanimously carried by those present, the Minutes of October 15, 1974, were approved as submitted.

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GENERAL ORDERS

On motion of Supervisor Lawyer, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried by those present, Warrant Register Claims for El Dorado County were approved and allowed for payment.

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At the recommendation of County Counsel, on motion of Supervisor Lane, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and unanimously carried by those present, the Claim submitted by Attorney Jon P. Beaver on behalf of Blondina Veerkamp for personal injuries in the amount of \$300,000.00, was denied.

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The Director of Environmental Health submitted the Development Schedule for El Dorado County's Solid Waste Management Plan for submittal to the State Solid Waste Management Board, as follows:

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and unanimously carried by those present, the Schedule was approved for submittal to the State Solid Waste Management Board.

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The Traffic Advisory Committee submitted the following recommendations for traffic control within the County:

- a. Placement of a stop sign at the intersection of Hassler and Union Ridge Roads, requiring southbound traffic on Union Ridge Road to stop;
- b. 40-MPH speed limit be adopted for a portion of Mt. Aukum Road lying between a point 300' south to 1,050' north of Cedar Creek Road;
- c. No downward speed zone be established on Mace Road between Pony Express Trail and Crystal Springs Road;
- d. 45-MPH zone on north end of Pioneer Trail be extended southerly to 0.23 miles south of Golden Bear Trail.

After consideration, on motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Lane, and unanimously carried by those present, the recommendations were approved, and the County Counsel was directed to prepare an ordinance amending the County Traffic Ordinance accordingly.

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The Assistant to the Board submitted a request from the County Employees
Association for donation of 75 "Hangtown Noose Pins" to be distributed at
the Annual California Public Employees Federation meeting on October 25-26,
1974; cost of pins being \$41.25.

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Johnson, Walker, and Lawyer; No: Supervisor Lane; Absent: Supervisor Stewart, the request was approved.

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The Assistant to the Board submitted a request that a Fuel Conservation Committee be appointed to be comprised of a representative from each of the following departments: Public Works, Sheriff, Civil Defense, and Administrative Office, to investigate and make recommendations to the Board on the reduction of fuel consumption by the County.

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Lane, and unanimously carried by those present, the request was approved.

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After checking the tape recording of the September 24, 1974, Meeting of the Board of Supervisors, Supervisor Walker requested that the Clerk amend her Minutes of that date in the 7th Paragraph on Page 414, to reflect a vote of "No" instead of "Aye" by Supervisor Lawyer, as it applied to the Planning Commission's request for clarification of the intent of the County's Mobilehome Hardship Clause, wherein the application of Mr. and Mrs. Kiker was considered.

On motion of Supervisor Lane, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and unanimously carried by those present, the Clerk was so requested to amend her Minutes of September 24, 1974.

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County Counsel submitted his opinion on the legality of Data Processing
Department supplying the general public, upon request, with certain "approved"
information from the Assessor's Office. (Continued from October 8, 1974)

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Lawyer, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board approved County Counsel's recommendation that surplus time and energy could be expended to provide such service if an appropriate fee is charged, and the Board also authorized Messrs. John Pettyjohn and John Wynn to purchase the information they have requested.

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Communications Officer submitted letter requesting that the Chairman be authorized to sign an Agreement with the State Department of Food and Agriculture for placement and operation of a Sheriff's mobile radio in a State Brand Inspector's vehicle to be used for joint County-State law enforcement activities involving livestock identification; said equipment will be County-owned and operated under County license.

On motion of Supervisor Lawyer, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried by those present, the request was approved and the Chairman authorized to sign Agreement for Mobile Radio Operation with the State.

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Director of Health Services submitted letter requesting that the Chairman be authorized to sign a renewal Lease, on a monthly basis, with the Tahoe Savings and Loan Association for office space for County's Department of Health, South Lake Tahoe, Environmental Services staff, in the monthly amount of \$350.00. 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Tahoe Regional Planning Agency's Principal Planner submitted letter requesting comments on the 1974 Long Range Planning Program, which consists of South Tahoe Urban Design Study; Design of a Housing and Land Data System for the Tahoe Basin; Natural Hazards of Lake Tahoe Basin; and Financial Feasibility Study of Tahoe Regional General Plan.

On motion of Supervisor Lane, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried by those present, the matter was continued to November 12, 1974, and referred to the Assistant to the Board for coordination with the Planning Department and other agencies involved with the various reports, to carry forth with the general principles expressed by this County regarding the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency.

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On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Lane, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board authorized payment of \$1,275.00 to Mr. James J. Oakham, Jr. for appraisal services for a portion of the Oetting property at the County Government Center, Placerville.

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State Department of Transportation submitted interim guidelines for implementation of Title VI provisions of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and for the conduct of compliance reviews relative to the Federal-Aid Highway Program, and requesting Assurance be signed that County will comply with appropriate sections when utilizing Federal Transportation funds.
