BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES April 15, 19 75

The Board convened in regular meeting. Present: Supervisors Franklin K. Lane, William V. D. Johnson, W. P. Walker, and Thomas L. Stewart. Absent: Supervisor Lawyer. Ann R. Macy, Board of Supervisors Clerk was present. Chairman Walker presided.

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The Invocation was offered by Reverend John Sharp, Seventh-Day Adventist Church, Placerville.

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The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was led by Supervisor Stewart.

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The Agenda was adopted, with one addition; the approval of the second letter of resignation received from Supervisor Raymond E. Lawyer, to be considered as the first item of business, on motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Lane, and unanimously carried by those present.

The New Business Agenda was adopted as submitted, on motion of Supervisor Lane, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried by those present.

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The Minutes of March 31, 1975, (an Adjourned Meeting continued from March 25, 1975), and the Minutes of April 8, 1975, were approved as submitted, on motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present.

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Chairman Walker read a second resignation letter received from Supervisor Raymond E. Lawyer withdrawing his earlier letter with resignation date of May 31, 1975, and at this time, submitting his resignation as Supervisor of the Fourth District, County of El Dorado, to become effective April 15, 1975.

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Lane, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board accepted, with regrets, Supervisor Lawyer's resignation and directed that the letter be forwarded to the County Clerk for notification of the Governor of California.

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GENERAL ORDERS

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried by those present, Warrant Register Claims for El Dorado County and Claims as submitted by the Community Action Council, Inc., were approved and allowed for payment.

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BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES April 15, 1975

Board considered the personnel recommendations submitted by the Assistant to the Board in the Personnel Letter dated April 15, 1975, and on motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Lane, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board approved Items 1 and 2, as recommended; i.e. Denied the request of the El Dorado Justice Court Judge that he be appointed as the County Circuit Judge and his salary be adjusted accordingly; and Approved the request for the County Auditor to set up proper accounting procedures in the El Dorado Justice Court.

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Director of Welfare submitted letter requesting authorization to procure by June 1, 1975, necessary personnel, equipment, and materials to accomplish the over-the-counter sale of Food Stamps, as required by the State by July 1, 1975, (100% State reimbursement of the initial and ongoing costs for this added function).

On motion of Supervisor Lane, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present, the request was approved; the following resolution was adopted amending the Authorized Personnel Resolution; and the Welfare Director was requested to draft a letter to the State legislators, the Governor, and the Attorney General to the effect that the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors does not believe that over-the-counter sale of Food Stamps is necessary in rural counties; and requesting a change in the State law which will make over-the-counter sale of Food Stamps discretionary at the County level:

RESOLUTION NO. 171-75

AMENDING THE AUTHORIZED PERSONNEL RESOLUTION (Welfare Department)

(For contents, see original resolution)

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Agricultural Commissioner submitted letter requesting authorization to purchase an economy pickup for County Service Area III to implement mosquito control pilot program on the Western Slope and requesting budget transfer in the amount of \$3,500.00 from the Service Area's appropriation for Contingency to Classification 3 -- Fixed Assets.

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried by those present, the request was approved.

At the recommendation of the Purchasing Agent, on motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board authorized that the economy pickup be purchased through the State's Cooperative Purchasing Program, at a savings of approximately \$500.00 under the 1975 price.

At the recommendation of the Executive Director, Community Action Council, on motion of Supervisor Lane, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present, the Chairman was authorized to sign the Statement of CSA (Community Services Administration) Grant in the amount of \$8,336.00 for the operation of the County Community Action Program for a one month period.

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On motion of Supervisor Lane, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board approved 39 Assignments to the Credit Bureau of El Dorado County from the Collections Department for Claims against those persons named on the Assignments dated April 15, 1975, beginning with the name of Sandra Blackmore and ending with the name of Robert Williams.

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On motion of Supervisor Lane, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board continued to April 22, 1975, the response by Phillips Petroleum Company to the deficiencies reported by the County Airports Director of the fixed base operations of Lake Tahoe Aviation, Inc., at the Lake Tahoe Airport.

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On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board approved the draft dated March 4, 1975, of the By-Laws of Sierra Economic Development District as amended January 22, 1974, with the request that Article III, Section 1(c), Line 4, be corrected to read: "...III, Section 1 hereof.", instead of "...III, Section C hereof.", and the following resolution was adopted:

RATIFYING AMENDMENTS TO BY-LAWS OF SIERRA ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT

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Supervisor Walker submitted the Fiscal Year 1976 Budget and Narrative Description of the Sierra Planning Organization and Sierra Economic Development District.

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Lane, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board approved the Budget, but took exception to the 12% increase in salaries and expenditure of capital assets of \$6,000, and the Board's representative was instructed to express these objections at the next SPO budget meeting on April 21, 1975.

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BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES April 15, 1975

Supervisor Walker submitted a model resolution which calls for the integration of the Sierra Economic Development District/Sierra Planning Organization boards. Passage of this resolution will amend the "Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement for the Purpose of Creating a Multi-County Joint Powers Agency to Coordinate all Areawide Programs within the Counties of Nevada, Placer, El Dorado, and Sierra, State of California for which Federal/State and Other Funds May be Available".

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Lane, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board approved that the duly appointed elected officials on the Sierra Planning Organization Board also represent their appointing authorities on the Sierra Economic Development District Board, and the following resolution was adopted:

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On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Lane, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board approved the installation of Telephone Busy Indicators between the Board's clerical staff and the Supervisors' offices, as recommended by Supervisor Lane, and the Communications Officer was requested to advise the Board at a later date the most feasible system for the installation in the Board's offices in the new facility.
