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The New Business Agenda was adopted on motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Lane, and unanimously carried, with the addition of two items; Reconsideration of Board Action on July 8, 1975 regarding authorization of the County Counsel to institute a Writ of Mandamus compelling the Governor to fill vacancy in Supervisorial District IV, and authorization for expenditure in amount of \$500 for dedication ceremony for County Administration Building at South Lake Tahoe.

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The Minutes of July 8, 1975 were approved as submitted, on motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Lane, Johnson and Walker; Abstain: Supervisor Stewart, who was not present at July 8 meeting.

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Executive Director, Community Action Council, Inc., submitted for Board consideration, proposed cost of living salary increases for Council employees

On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and carried 50-/ by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Lane, Walker and Stewart;
No: Supervisor Johnson, salary increases for Council employees were approved, as submitted.

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Purchasing Agent submitted an inventory of surplus County property (office equipment, furniture, etc.) located in the former Medical Building at South Lake Tahoe, and recommended that the property be disposed of in the following order of priority: (1) Governmental Agencies; (2) Special Districts and (3) Private non-profit organizations. (Referred 6/24/75)

On motion of Supervisor Lane, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried, the Board approved disposal of the equipment in the following order: (1) Governmental Agencies and (2) Special Districts to be allowed to select items of equipment, and any items not utilized after 30 days to be sold at public auction.

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County Surveyor submitted a letter advising that monumenting has been completed for El Dorado Hills Townhouses, and recommended the release of \$1,500.00 from Bank of America Time Certificate of Deposit. On motion of Supervisor Lane, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried, the Board approved release of \$1,500.00 from Bank of America Time Certificate of Deposit.
