BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES August 26, 19 75

The Board convened in regular meeting. Present: Supervisors Franklin K. Lane, William V. D. Johnson, W. P. Walker, and Thomas L. Stewart. (Supervisorial District IV is vacant). Also present: Ann R. Macy, Board of Supervisors Clerk. Chairman Walker presided.

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The Invocation was offered by Supervisor Lane.

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The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was led by Supervisor Stewart.

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The Agenda was adopted on motion of Supervisor Stewart, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried by those present.

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The New Business Agenda was adopted on motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Johnson, Walker, and Stewart; Abstain: Supervisor Lane.

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Supervisor Johnson moved to adopt the Minutes of July 29, 1975, after the following amendment to the first two of seven conditions required by the Board in their action overruling the Planning Commission's decision to deny the acceptance of Negative Declarations on 13 Parcel Maps in the Volcanoville area (See Pages 342; 343; and 344 of said Minutes): Supervisor Johnson stated that his motion had not made it clear in conditions 1 and 2 that the roads would be dedicated to public use; therefore, since it was his intention that the motion reflect this, he requested that the two conditions be altered, and Resolution No. 313-75 be amended accordingly:

- 1. Restore Kentucky Flat Road to be usable for private passenger vehicles with adequate signing. At the time of recording of the final parcel maps that proof be furnished of right of way, dedicated to public use, from Mr. Maurice Indursky. Assure right of way, dedicated to public use, over the road between Volcanoville Road and Wentworth Springs Road to each subsequent purchaser.
- 2. Requirement of Tunnel Hill Road access, dedicated to public use.

Supervisor Stewart seconded the motion, and it was carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Johnson, Walker, and Stewart; Abstain: Supervisor Lane (who was not present at the meeting of July 29, 1975).

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On motion of Supervisor Lane, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Lane, Walker, and Stewart; Abstain: Supervisor Johnson, the Minutes of August 19, 1975, were approved, as submitted.

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On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board approved 33 Assignments to the Credit Bureau of El Dorado County from the Collection Department for Claims against those persons named on the Assignments dated August 26, 1975; copies of which are on file in the Board of Supervisors Office, commencing with the name of Marie C. Del Conte and ending with the name of Inge Layson.

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On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board adopted the following resolution requesting the Resolution Committee, County Supervisors Association of California, to remove CSAC's President's discretionary powers to deviate from the County Platform under special conditions:

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES August 26, 19 75

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried by those present, the Chairman was authorized to sign a letter to the County Supervisors Association of California approving and recommending the following five additions to the County Supervisors Association of California County Platform, which was submitted by the Sacramento-Mother Lode Regional Association of County Supervisors for consideration at the annual meeting of CSAC in Anaheim:

- Any change in the structure or boundaries of County Government shall be subject to majority vote by the electorate of each political entity;
- The establishment of an additional tier of government intervening between the State and County or City Governments shall be subject to a majority vote of the electorate;
- 3. Local government and services should not be further diluted or fragmented by continuing mandates and directives from the State in absence of proper funding. Where mandates and funding are directed -- even with funding it should include inflation and growth factors and funding adequate to provide for mandates;
- 4. The State should take a positive and active stand in protecting States Rights in jurisdictional self-districting (regions) and in providing services to the people and in all other constitutional provisions reserved to the States;
- 5. Other than the Board of Supervisors, any change in the status of other County elected officials shall be subject to a majority vote of the electorate instead of centralizing power and removing from the control of the electorate those officials responsible for the well-being of County citizens, and the State should encourage the strenthening of local initiative and options for funding services by local elected officials.

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On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board authorized the Chairman to sign a letter to the Environmental Protection Agency, Washington, D.C., requesting said Agency to take immediate action to allow the use of M-44 spring-loaded, sodium cyanide gun for predator control (Coyote-Getter).

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The matter of reconsideration by the Board of their action of August 19, 1975, regarding conditions set by the Board on rezoning of .75 acre of land in the Rescue area from Agricultural to Single Family Residential, petitioned by James C. Blackketter, was continued to September 2, 1975, on motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present.

The Board informally continued the communication received from the El Dorado Post No. 119, American Legion, which expressed their concern on the proposal to build a barn in front of the Veteran's Building at the County Fairgrounds, to the Recreation Director for review of those plans with the American Legion Post No. 119.

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On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board continued to September 10, 1975, the proposed Resolution submitted by the Director of Environmental Health for the County sewage system design.

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Earlier in this meeting the Assistant to the Board was requested to submit a proposed Screening Committee for the review of applications for the vacant position of County Planning Director. The Assistant to the Board submitted the following names for approval:

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried by those present, the Screening Committee was approved, as submitted.
