The Board convened in regular meeting. Present: Supervisors William V.D. Johnson, W. P. Walker, Lloyd R. Kutter, and Thomas L. Stewart -who was present for morning session only. Absent: Supervisor Franklin K. Lane. Ann R. Macy, Board of Supervisors Clerk was also present.

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Invocation was offered by Reverend John Sharp, Seventh-Day Adventist Church.

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The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was led by Supervisor Stewart.

L. D. Stodick, President, El Dorado County Taxpayers Association, presented Supervisor Johnson with a framed scroll penned in script, commending Supervisor Johnson for his six years of dedicated service to the citizens of El Dorado County.

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The Agenda was adopted on motion of Supervisor Stewart, seconded by Supervisor Kutter, and unanimously carried by those present.

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On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried by those present, the New Busines Agenda was adopted with one addition, as Item 4; the submittal of a summary of cost of implementation and enforcement of CTRPA's Draft Land Use Ordinance, by the Assistant to the Board.

The Minutes of September 10, 1975, were approved as submitted, on motion of Supervisor Stewart, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried by those present.

#### GENERAL ORDERS

Warrant Register Claims and Claims submitted by the Community Action Council, Inc., were approved and allowed for payment, on motion of So -/ Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried by those present.

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board approved the 4th Revision to the Senior Nutrition ProgramBudget for 1975.

Director of Health Services submitted letter stating that on July 18, 1975, this County received \$15,887.00; a supplemental appropriation for Mental Health Services, and proposed that of this amount \$4,999.00 be utilized to increase the Agreement with the Regents of the University of California, dated March 25, 1975, for Fiscal Year 1975-76, with the remainder to remain uncommitted to offset an anticipated decline in patient fee collections caused by economic conditions.

On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Walker, Kutter, and Stewart; No: Supervisor Johnson; Absent: Supervisor Lane, the proposal was approved, and the Chairman authorized to sign the Addendum to the Agreement increasing the contract in the amount of \$4,999.00.

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On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and A unanimously carried by those present, the proposed Joint Powers Agreement between the counties of El Dorado, Nevada, Placer, Sacramento, Sierra, Sutter, Yolo, and Yuba, to be designated as a Health Service Area, was continued to September 23, 1975, for consideration and comments by the Board.

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County Counsel submitted for the Chairman's signature, a Lease Agreement with Motorola Communications and Electronics, Inc., for radio equipment for the Building Department and Environmental Health Department, at a monthly rental of \$395.84. On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Kutter, and unanimously carried by those present, the matter was continued to September 30, 1975.

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Board considered results of bid opening held September 11, 1975, for Phase II of the County Government Center construction; Contract C - Carpet, and Contract E - Site Development; Millwork; Kitchen Equipment; and Pedestal Floor. Bids were received for Contract C from: Simas Floor Co., Inc., Sacramento; Western Contract Furnishers, Sacramento; L&M Carpet Service, Vallejo; B. T. Mancini Co., Inc., Sacramento; The Ellis Company, Sacramento; and Rugen Construction Co., Sacramento. Bids were received fro Contract E from: John F. Otto, Sacramento; Murchison Construction Company, Sacramento; and Rugen Construction Co., Sacramento.

At the recommendation of the Architect, on motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present, Contract C was awarded to low bidder, Simas Floor Co., Inc., Sacramento, in the amount of \$50,936.00; and Contract E was awarded to low bidder, John F. Otto, Sacramento, in the amount of \$746,000.00.

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Board considered results of bid opening held September 11, 1975, for the Structural Section Reconstruction of Coach Lane and Cameron Park Drive; bids having been received from the following: Teichert Construction, Sacramento; Granite Construction Co., Sacramento; H-B Investment, Sacramento; R. C. Collet Inc., Woodland; Delta Construction Co., Folsom, and Gabriel Mendez, Inc., Newcastle. (Continued)

At the recommendation of the Assistant Director of Public Works, on motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried by those present, the contract was awarded to low bidder, Teichert Construction, Sacramento, for total bid of \$51,820.00, and the requested budget revision required to provide the estimated funds for this project was approved, as follows:

Road 11Union Mine Road -Hwy. 49 to Disposal Site\$49,000.00Road 200Coach Lane and Cameron Park Drive,<br/>Reconstruction of Structural Section\$55,000.00

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board waived the reading of the proposed Ordinance amending the El Dorado County Ordinance Code relating to Bond Increase for the Public Guardian, and continued it for adoption to September 23, 1975.

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On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried by those present, the 1980 Functional Classification Road System Map considered by the Board on September 2, 1975, and which was conditionally approved at that time, subject to the Local Transportation Commission's approval, was continued to September 23, 1975; awaiting said Commission's approval thereon.

Chairman, Alcoholism Advisory Board, submitted a letter recommending that the State Department of Health be requested to delay an consideration of a change in certification procedures until such time as it can be demonstrated that the standards of the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Hospitals, a private corporation, are applicable to alcohol recovery homes, and that their fees are reduced to a tolerable level.

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On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Kutter, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board adopted the position expressed by the Alcoholism Advisory Board, and the Chairman was authorized to sign a letter to the State Department of Health to that effect.

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On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board placed on file the proposed Ordinance amending the Public Services and Facilities Element of the Regional Plan and Ordinance No. 22, which amends the Transportation Element of the Regional Plan, submitted by the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency.

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On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board approved 48 Assignments to the Credit Bureau of El Dorado County from the Collection Department for Claims against those persons named on the Assignments dated September 16, 1975; copies of which are on file in the Board of Supervisors Office, beginning with the name of Tony Nelson/and Susan Green, and ending with the name of David Eugene Johnson.

Gerald P. Desmarais, El Dorado County Director of Health Services, submitted a letter terminating his services with the County on Friday, September 26, 1975; stating that he is accepting a position with the California Association of Rehabilitation Facilities as Executive Director.

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On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried by those present, Mr. Desmarais' resignation was accepted, and the Board, informally, requested that a plaque be prepared for presentation to him at the next Board meeting on September 23, 1975.

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On motion of Supervisor Stewart, seconded by Supervisor Kutter, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board continued to September 30, 1975, the results of bid opening, and subsequent award, of Bid No. 693 -Two Four-wheel Drive Vehicles for Surveyor.
