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Warrant Register Claims for El Dorado County and Claims as submitted by the Community Action Council, Inc., were approved and allowed for payment, on motion of Supervisor Lane, seconded by Supervisor Kutter, and unanimously carried by those present.

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Supervisor Johnson arrived

Airports Director submitted letter requesting authorization to install radio controlled sequential lighting on the runway at Lake Tahoe Airport at a total cost of approximately \$12,000, and requesting the Auditor be authorized to transfer funds from Special Aviation to Enterprise account.

After consideration, on motion of Supervisor Lane, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Lane, Kutter, and Stewart; Noes: Supervisors Johnson and Walker, the rezoning was held in abeyance until the regulations for the Agricultural and Estate Residential zones have been revised, and until the Greenstone Area Plan (which would be a new land use plan for that area) has been heard and adopted by the Board.

There being no further business, the Board adjourned to Tuesday, November 18, 1975, at 10:00 a.m.
