The Board convened in regular meeting. Present: Supervisors Franklin K. Lane, William V. D. Johnson, W. P. Walker, Lloyd R. Kutter, and Thomas L. Stewart. Also present: Ann R. Macy, Board of Supervisors Clerk. Chairman Lane presided.

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The Invocation was offered by Reverend John Sharp, Seventh Day Adventist Church.

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The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was led by Supervisor Stewart.

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The Agenda was adopted on motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried.

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The New Business Agenda was adopted on motion of Supervisor Stewart, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried.

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The Minutes of February 17 and February 24, 1976, were approved as submitted, on motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried.

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#### GENERAL ORDERS

Warrant Register Claims for El Dorado County and Claims as submitted by the Community Action Council, Inc., were approved and allowed for payment, on motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried.

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On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried, the Board approved the Joint Operating and Financial Plan for law enforcement services in the Eldorado National Forest for the Fiscal Year 1975-76 for maximum reimbursement of \$29,100.00 from the U. S. Forest Service, and the Chairman was authorized to sign said Plan.

Auditor/Controller submitted a schedule of audits and other accounting work proposed to be performed during the remainder of the Fiscal Year, including: Regular Audits; Special Projects; and follow-up work on the Contract Auditor's recommendations.

On motion of Supervisor Stewart, seconded by Supervisor Kutter, and unanimously carried, the Board approved the balance of the Fiscal Year program submitted by the Auditor, including the follow-up on the Contract Audit -- with the mutual agreement of the department heads, and requested a report back from the Auditor.

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On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried, the Board continued to March 9, 1976, the request of Pioneer Community Hospital for an exchange of equipment valued at \$23,000.00 in payment of their debt to the County in the amount of \$17,000.00.

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The Board reconsidered the return of the \$100.00 filing fee paid by Messrs. William McCabe and Curtis Fox for their Appeal of the Environmental Impact Report filed by Theodore Char (Foothill Oaks), and on motion of Supervisor Lane, seconded by Supervisor Kutter, and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Lane, Walker, Kutter, and Stewart; No: Supervisor Johnson, the Board authorized a \$75.00 refund to the applicants, thereby retaining only the cost of the Appeal.

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On motion of Supervisor Kutter, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried, the Board continued to March 9,1976, a position statement regarding the relocation of the Placerville Campus of the American River College, presently located at the County Fairgrounds.

On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried, the Clerk was instructed to send an invitation to the Los Rios Community College Board of Trustees to attend a Policy Review Session on March 10, 1976, at 3:00 p.m. regarding the relocation of the Placerville Campus of the American River College.

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Myrtle Baker, Chairperson, Bicentennial Commission, was present with a number of sketches for consideration by the Board for the El Dorado County Bicentennial Medallion. Berna Applegate, the artists, was also available to assist the Board.

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, Sketch No. 4 (Sutter's Mill) was selected for the reverse side of the medallion. (Continued)

On motion of Supervisor Lane, seconded by Supervisor Kutter, and unanimously carried, Sketch No. 1 (Wagon Train and Gold panner) was selected for the obverse side of the Medallion, with the change in the lettering deleting "Panorama of History" and in its place, adding "California", and also the placement of an Indian somewhere at the rear of the Wagon Train.

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On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried, the following policy was enacted requiring routine safety inspections of all County vehicles by the Department of Public Works:

- 1. A routine safety inspection of all County vehicles by the Department of Public Works at 20,000 mile intervals. Any repairs necessary shall be performed to the vehicles before being returned to the department. The cost of such inspection and repairs shall be the responsibility of the department operating the vehicle.
- 2. The 4,000 mile servicing for lubrication shall also include routine inspections of tire conditions, windshield conditions, windshield wipers, horns, safety equipment, etc. Any repairs or replacements needed shall be made before the vehicle is returned to the operating department. Repairs shall be billed to the department operating the vehicle.

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On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried, the Board placed on file the State Department of Finance Census Report, including the El Dorado County portion for the period ending July 10, 1975.

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The Board considered the Introductory Ordinance amending the County Grading Ordinance for the Lake Tahoe Basin, sponsored by Supervisor Stewart.

On motion of Supervisor Stewart, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried, the ordinance was introduced, the reading thereof was waived, and it was continued to March 9, 1976, for adoption.

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On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried, the Board appointed the following persons who were nominated by their respective supervisor, to the El Dorado County Fair Association Board of Directors, for terms to be coterminus of the nominating supervisor:

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried, the Chairman was authorized to sign a Release of Agreement for Virgil Schrader, individually and as conservator of the person testate of Stella S. Schrader, his wife, said Agreement recorded at Book 1180, Page 295, Official Records of El Dorado County, and being in consideration of the subordination of a lien recorded in Book 1068, at Page 720, Official Records of El Dorado County: said Release of Agreement discharging all property encumbered by the Agreement recorded in Volume 1180, Page 295, of the County's Official Records.

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County Collection Officer submitted two Compromise Settlements: One for a Probation Department case involving the minor son of Donald Kennedy for detention in the year 1970 in the amount of \$589.23, with the recommendation that the County accept as settlement the offer of \$250.00; and the other being a GR Medical case involving the Estate of Robert J. Elliott in the amount of \$4,960.28, with the recommendation that the County accept as settlement \$2,000.00. On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried, both Compromise Settlements were approved.

The Planning Director reviewed each petition for the Board, and advised that the Planning Commission had recommended approval.

Since all property owners within 500 feet had been notified 10 days prior to the hearings set for this date and time, according to law, the Chairman continued with the hearings. (Continued)

A telegram was received from adjacent property owner Farren T. Kohler, Rancho Palos Verdes, California, in favor of the rezonings.

Those present and in favor of the Ordinance, were: Bob Heald, Assistant Manager, Blodgett Forest; Mary Lou Onetto; Phyllis Fox; Howard Nielsen; Ed Bacchi; Elwin VeerKamp; and John Forni.

On motion of Supervisor Kutter, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried, the ordinance which was before the Board for hearing, was amended by the revised ordinance (submitted by Supervisor Kutter).

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried, the Hearing was continued to March 9, 1976.

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Deputy County Counsel advised the Board that the Minor Land Division Ordinance, governing parcel maps, is presently being reviewed by the Land Division Review Committee; and also, that said Committee has completed its work on the Major Land Division Ordinance, which will be submitted to the Planning Commission and the Board of Supervisors shortly.

Howard Heilman, Chairman of the Land Division Review Committee, was also present, and stated that the proposed Parcel Map Ordinance would be ready for submittal to the Board in two or three weeks.

There was no action taken by the Board.

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Mrs. Evelyn Kuraisa was present and advised the Board of her inability to pay her taxes on her property in downtown Lake Tahoe, and of the restrictions placed upon that property by the California Tahoe Regional Planning Agency which has precluded her from being able to dispose of, or do anything with, her land which she has owned since 1946. She further informed the Board that she is in arrears on her taxes for five years due to financial hardship caused by the illness, and eventually the death of her husband. She asked for an extension of one year to bring her taxes current.

On motion of Supervisor Stewart, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Johnson, Walker, Kutter, and Stewart; No: Supervisor Lane (Supervisor Lane stated his "No" vote was only due to the fact that he felt an action should be taken against CTRPA), the Board instructed County Counsel to study the matter and make a determination as to what authority or powers this Board has as to forgiveness of taxes; the Tax Collector was instructed to bring before the Board information as to what he feels might be permissible within the law, and the responsibility he has as Tax Collector in this regard; and the County Assessor was requested to submit to the Board the past 5-year record on Mrs. Kuraisa's property.

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The hour being 6:00 p.m., the Board adjourned to the following day, Wednesday, at 10:00 a.m. for a continued meeting in order to complete the business on the Agenda.

The Board convened in an Adjourned (Continued) Meeting. Present: Supervisors Franklin K. Lane, William V. D. Johnson, W. P. Walker, Lloyd R. Kutter, and Thomas L. Stewart. Also present: Ann R. Macy, Board of Supervisors Clerk. Chairman Lane presided.

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Supervisor Stewart submitted recommendations for the restructuring of the Governing Body of the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency (TRPA), in an effort to make said agency strong enough to allow the repeal of the State agency, the California Tahoe Regional Planning Agency (CTRPA). Supervisor Stewart asked for Board consideration of his recommendations for modifications and additions to the TRPA Compact involving the following: (1) Financing Agency Operation; (2) Membership of Governing Body; (3) Simple Majority Rule; (4) Presidential Appointee to be a Full Voting Member of the Governing Body; (5) California - Tahoe Regional Planning Agency; and (6) a New County at Tahoe.

After consideration, the Board on motion of Supervisor Stewart, seconded by Supervisor Kutter, and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Lane, Walker, Kutter, and Stewart; No: Supervisor Johnson, approved the proposal as submitted, with an amendment to the Membership section to the effect that alternates for the State primary members are to be either legislators serving the Basin, or residents of the Lake Tahoe Basin.

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Sierra Planning Organization requested advice on their proposal to possibly utilize the services provided by the California Innovation Group, its organization, and possible activities being made available to the Boards of Supervisors and City Councils of the four counties served by the Sierra Planning Organization (SPO).

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried, the Board declared their intent to maintain Supervisor Walker's (the Board's representative to SPO) previous position of opposition.

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present, the request was approved.
