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Director of Health Services submitted for the Chairman's signature, Contract No. 76-55582 with the State Department of Health for Family Planning Services for the period July 1, 1976, through June 30, 1977, in the amount of \$67,300.00.

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried, the Chairman was authorized to sign.

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Director, County Training Programs, requested that the Chairman be authorized to sign modification to subgrant agreement for the continued operation of Title I Classroom Training Program, extending incentive payments to Classroom Training enrollees through September 30, 1976, with no change to the original allocation.

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried, the Chairman was authorized to sign.

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Executive Director, Community Action Council, Inc., submitted a letter requesting, due to time delays and the redundancy inherent in the current Grant Procedures, review of the County's procedures for handling grants between the County, the Clearinghouse, and the funding agency.

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried, the Board advised that the policy that was adopted concerning application for Federal Grants applies only to new grants for new types of programs that the County will enter into; and the matter of modifications or minor changes to the original grant, or annual renewals of the grant, was not contemplated to fall within this policy.

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Director, Community Programs, submitted a letter requesting the Chairman be authorized to sign Special Subgrant Agreement for operation of the Summer Youth Recreation Program (No. OG 90178-01), in the amount of \$4,908.00.

On motion of Supervisor Kutter, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Lane, Walker, Kutter, and Stewart. No: Supervisor Johnson, the Chairman was authorized to sign.

Sierra Planning Organization submitted a letter requesting comments on El Dorado County Community Action Agency's Summer Youth Recreation Program.

On motion of Supervisor Stewart, seconded by Supervisor Kutter, and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Lane, Walker, Kutter, and Stewart; No: Supervisor Johnson, the Board commented favorably.

Assistant to the Board submitted a request of the South Lake Tahoe Humane Society that the Auditor be authorized to advance them \$12,000.00, representing their allocation for a two-month period.

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried, the request was approved comprising the month of July 1976 and the month of June 1977; i.e. the first and last month's payments.

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County Recreation Commission submitted a letter recommending approval and acceptance of Grant Deed from Alexander & Baldwin, Inc. for the Bayley House and approximately 10 acres in Pilot Hill, and requesting the Chairman be authorized to sign the License Agreement relating thereto.

On motion of Supervisor Kutter, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried, the matter was continued indefinitely until the easement and the use of the barn is agreed upon.

Purchasing Agent submitted a letter stating that after an extensive effort had been made to obtain competitive bids from several insurance companies for the County's Primary Liability Insurance policies, only one bid was received, which met the specifications, from Vukovich Insurance Agency for Stonewall Insurance Company as follows:

On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Lane, Johnson, Walker, and Stewart; No: Supervisor Kutter, the Board authorized the assistance of the County Surveyor, as requested; however, the Health Department does not have the capability of performing a percolation test which was also requested, so the Board was unable to accommodate them in that regard.

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Golden Empire Health Systems Agency submitted a letter enclosing for approval, the amended version of the Agreement of Joint Powers between the Counties of El Dorado, Nevada, Placer, Sacramento, Sierra, Sutter, Yolo, and Yuba for the purpose of creating a public regional planning body to implement the National Health Planning and Resources Development Act of 1974, PL 93-641, known as the Golden Empire Health Systems Agency.

Considerable discussion ensued on the merits of this "regional" agency; each Board member expressing his individual opinion that this County could better solve its own problem of health care, than through the dictates of this regional body. It was the desire of the Board that the records reflect that this county is not in agreement with this regional agency; however, being completely cognizant that the only means of receiving funding is through participation in a regional agency, the Board considered that this was a lesser of two evils, and that by their participation at least they might have a hand in the control of funds.

On motion of Supervisor Kutter, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Supervisors Lane, Walker, Kutter, and Stewart; No: Supervisor Johnson, the Chairman was authorized to sign the Joint Powers Agreement, as amended.

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On motion of Supervisor Lane, seconded by Supervisor Kutter, and unanimously carried, the Board declared their support of Assembly Bill 4107 which purports to set mortgaging rates, and to provide for the placement of mobilehomes on foundations, and also sets a maximum inspection fee, -- only if the maximum fee schedule is eliminated, and provided that the correction is made as to the dimensions of the mobilehome.

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On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried, the Chairman was authorized to execute Releases of Lien, discharging all property encumbered by the Agreements to Reimburse County for Public Assistance as recorded in the Official Records of El Dorado County as follows:

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Hearing was held as duly advertised on the request of Amador Disposal Company for an increase in refuse rates in the Grizzly Flat, Somerset, and Latrobe areas.

Director of Environmental Health reviewed the request in all its aspects, and recommended approval of the increase.

There were no opponents and the Hearing was closed.

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried, the rate increase was approved and the following resolution was adopted:
