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On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board took the following action on personnel matters: An Account Clerk II position from part-time to full-time was authorized for the Public Guardian/Veterans Service Officer; and an additional Superior Court Clerk was authorized for the County Clerk in connection with the third Superior Court Department at South Lake Tahoe, and the following resolution was adopted accordingly:

In a separate action on this subject, Mrs. Evelyn Robeson, representing the Commission on the Status of Women, submitted a letter requesting that the County encourage all South Lake Tahoe physicians to participate on an interim basis to provide prenatal care and delivery for Medi-Cal women, and that the County pay the difference where necessary in doctor's current malpractice premiums so that they may assist the County in this regard. On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present, this request was referred to Dr. Weidmer (Director of Health Services) for a report back to the Board, as to whether or not this is legally feasible.

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Executive Director, Community Action Council, submitted a letter recommending the Chairman be authorized to sign an Agreement with the State for funding in the amount of \$21,558.69 for three CETA employees to work in the County's Emergency Energy Conservation Project.

AMENDING THE EL DORADO COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE (Lumsden - Diamond Springs)

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286-100-96 Hearing was held as duly advertised on the rezoning of lands in the Shingle Springs area from Estate Residential to Commercial, consisting of 3.5 acres, petitioned by Arnold A. Jacoby. Planning Commission recommended approval, and the Senior Planned enumerated the findings of the Commission, as follows:

- The proposal is consistent with the General Plan;
- 2. The proposal is bordered by the freeway to the south, commercial zoning to be east, and a natural tree barrier to the north and west;
- 3. Adequate services can be provided as follows: Water El Dorado Irrigation District; Sewage Disposal - septic tanks (in the service area of proposed Sanitation District II) and, Fire District - Shingle Springs Fire Protection District.

Three letters of protest to the rezoning were received from: Judy Wheeler; Herschell Hoodenpyl; and a letter signed by Judy Wheeler, Secretary of the Sierra View Landowners (purporting to represent 20 property owners in the area). Also received was a Petition opposing the rezoning, signed by 20 property owners in the area. (Continued)

Those present and opposed to the rezoning were: Phyllis Gish; Ruth Loeffenbein; Charlene Hensley; and Wayne Neuenschwander.

After consideration, on motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Stewart, and unanimously carried by those present, the rezoning request was denied, without prejudice.

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Hearing was held as duly advertised on the establishment of a Recreational Facilities Zoning District (RF). (Introduced 10/26/76 -- Continued from 11/2/76). There were no protests, and the Hearing was closed.

On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Kutter, and unanimously carried by those present, the following ordinance was adopted after the deletion of the words, "and human resources" at the end of the sentence under Section 9433(b):

ORDINANCE NO. 1716

ESTABLISHING RECREATIONAL FACILITIES ZONE

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Resolution of Intention No. 284-76 having been adopted by the Board on November 2, 1976, and proper notice having been posted, hearing was held to consider abandoning a 10-foot public utility easement on the east side of Lot No. 275, Montgomery Estates Unit No. 5, South Lake Tahoe. Planning Commission recommended approval and advised that Quitclaim Deeds had been received from all parties involved, including public utility companies. There were no protests and the Hearing was closed.

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Kutter, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board determined that said public utility easement on the east side of Lot No. 275 in Montgomery Estates Unit No. 5, South Lake Tahoe was no longer necessary for public use, and the following resolution was adopted:

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At the recommendation of the Planning Commission, on motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Kutter, and unanimously carried by those present, the Tentative Map of Sleepy Hollow Unit No. 5 was approved, subject to the following conditions:

- Completion of road improvements, drainage systems and setting of final monuments in accordance with the requirements of the regulations for rural subdivisions or execution of an agreement to install these improvements and monuments secured by bond or cash deposit;
- Provision of lots adequate for individual sewage disposal in accordance with the requirements of the El Dorado County Health Department;
- 3. Subject to the applicable provisions of Article 8, Rural Subdivisions, as contained in the El Dorado County Subdivision Ordinance and compliance with Resolution No. 513-68 requiring establishment of a Landowners Association for the maintenance of roads and any common areas;
- 4. Subject to all roads and easements being dedicated to public use;
- 5. Fire hydrants to be provided and spaced in coordination with the local fire chief;
- Subject to the Resources Conservation District letter of July 9, 1976, regarding soil erosion control;
- 7. Subject to the provisions of a road connection to the easterly boundary of the project at a location acceptable to the developer of the El Dorado County Department of Public Works and Planning Staff;
- 8. Subject to the unit number being changed (lots renumbered for the final map); and,
- Submission within a 30-day period of additional soils and hydraulic informalion to Mr. Steve Walker of the Department of Environmental Health.



At the recommendation of the Planning Commission, on motion of Supervisor Kutter, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried by those present, the Tentative Map of Camino Heights Unit No. 2 was approved, subject to the following conditions:

- Approval of construction drawings and specifications by Director of Public Works prior to proceeding with any subdivision work;
- Completion of road improvements, lot accesses, drainage systems and water system, sewage system and setting of final monuments in accordance with requirements of the Department of Public Works, Health Department, County Surveyor and the El Dorado County Subdivision Ordinance;
- 3. Subject to the letter from the Resource Conservation District of Aug. 4, 1976, regarding erosion control measures;
- 4. Subject to the placement of a public utility in the 20' front yard setback to facilitate the placement of underground utility cables;
- 5. Applicant has requested a waiver of the requirement to extend water and sewer lines to the seven individual lots. The staffs of the Public Works and Planning Departments concur with the requested waiver;
- 6. Subject to applicant filing Covenants and Restrictions that will be the same as Unit I and provide for owners in this unit to become members of the same Homeowners' Association; and,
- 7. The approval of this Tentative Map shall be subject to the Planning Staff notifying the State Division of Real Estate that any white paper concerning this development make a statement clearly outlining for future buyers, that the individual utility line hookups will be their responsibility rather than that of the developer.

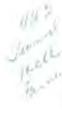


Executive Secretary, Planning Commission, submitted a letter stating that the Planning Commission recommended the approval of the developer's request for a one year extension to the Tentative Map for Huckleberry Ridge Estates Rural Subdivision, subject to the original conditions, and the addition of five more conditions.

On motion of Supervisor Johnson, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board approved the extension of the Tentative Map of Huckleberry Ridge Subdivision to January 1, 1978, as recommended, subject to the following additional conditions:

- The existing bridge providing access to the project to be improved to a two-lane configuration and designed to accommodate an H-15 vehicle load and to be approved by the Department of Public Works regarding bridge design and access;
- 2. Add a non-vehicular easement along the easterly boundary line of Lot 1 on the Final Map so that Ellsworth Road, south of the intersection, will no longer be inside the boundaries of the subdivision;
- 3. The Final Map to show the entrance road right-of-way, into the project, as a part of the Subdivision;
- 4. Rock gutters to be provided along side of the roads; and,
- Provide no less than 50' setbacks for structures from the U.S.F.S. boundary at the south perimeter of the property.





Director of Planning submitted a letter stating that the Planning Staff Hill Farms Rural Subdivision, plus the added condition requested by the concurred with the conditions of approval of the Tentative Map of Tunnel Environmental Health Department, should the Board agree that said subdivision's Tentative Map is legally extendable beyond the 30-month period allowable by County Ordinance. Said letter of concurrence is in response to a request by the developers, via their attorney, Daryl J. McKinstry, that the extension be allowed pursuant to Section 66452.6 of the Government Code which would permit an extension to May 28, 1977.

After due consideration, on motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Kutter, and unanimously carried by those present, the Board waived their ordinance requirements and granted the extension to May 28, 1977, pursuant to Government Code Section 66452.6, subject to the original conditions, plus the additional condition required by the Environmental Health Department, as follows: "Completion and certification of the "Guidelines for Waste Disposal from Land Developments" and "Information Needs for Waste Disposal from Land Developments".

On motion of Supervisor Stewart, seconded by Supervisor Walker, and unanimously carried by those present, the cash deposits were released for the aforementioned subdivisions, as recommended.

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On motion of Supervisor Walker, seconded by Supervisor Johnson, and unanimously carried by those present, the Chairman was authorized to sign a letter to the State Energy and Resources Conservation and Development Commission expressing this County's concern with the rigid language in said Commission's proposed rules and regulations pertaining to the future average increase of allowable electrical energy, in relation to the actual increases or electrical energy experienced by this County.

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There being no further business, the Board adjourned to Tuesday, November 30, 1976, at 9:30 a.m.
