Hearing was held as duly advertised to consider an addition to existing Agricultural Preserve No. 202 in the Somerset/Fairplay/Mt. Aukum area. consisting of 54 acres, petitioned by Eldred Kunkel. The Planning Commission recommended approval, based on the following findings:

 The request is consistent with the General Plan (REA 5-20 acre parcels) (proposed RRA10-160);
