Hearing to consider the negative declaration, introduction of 32. Ordinance amending Section 16.12.090(C)(3), and adoption of Resolution amending Resolution No. 245-89 providing for an amendment to the "Administrative Procedures, Interpretation and Policy Direction" pertaining to land dedication or in-lieu fees for park purposes. BOARD ACTION - Ordinance introduced with staff directed to Q97make revisions to same addressing concerns raised in the letter dated 10/7/91 from the El Dorado Hills Community Services District (CSD), the reading thereof waived; and staff directed to bring back the final draft for adoption, and to respond to the question posed by Kimberly Beal, of Smith & Gabbert, Inc., of whether County Counsel will require a release form, signed by the developer or applicant, in order to release the appraisal to CSD's, etc. DGSCU

- 33. Hearing to consider amending the Hiking and Equestrian Trails Master Plan, Section 3, Page 6, Paragraph d, as follows: "Approval of such discretionary entitlements for parcels containing the existing and proposed trails, as delineated on the 'Trails Master Plan' map shall be conditioned to provide an irrevocable offer to dedicate an easement for public access for the designated trails".
