50. Health Department advising the Board of current concerns and issues regarding the County Medical Services Program (CMSP). (Continued 10/19/93, Item 51) BOARD ACTION - Supervisor Upton was appointed as the Board's representative to the California State Association of Counties (CSAC) regarding CMSP issues, and the Board approved the following recommendations of the Health Department:

(1) support having one Health Officer, one Health | 0214 Administrator, and two Welfare Directors on the Administrative Committee responsible for operations, and developing and recommending budgets to the Executive Committee of the 34member CMSP Board of Directors;

(2) support a single case management system for all 34 counties;

(3) consolidate all efforts toward a single case management system for MediCal and CMSP. NuCBNU

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51. Transportation Department advising that the Committee to Save Finnon Lake is recommending the Chairman be authorized to sign a letter to the Department of Fish and Game requesting a decision be made on the future ownership of the Finnon Lake property; said Committee further recommending staff be authorized to negotiate a 90-day option with the Department of Fish and Game for same.
