Hearing to consider Tentative Parcel Map 92-55 creating two five-acre parcels, with a design waiver to reduce the road width for on-site and off-site road to 20 feet instead of the 24 feet required under Standard Plan 101-C, on 10.06 acres in the Camino Area, (District IV) Applicant: Jerry Mix. (Referred 7/12/94, Item 26) BOARD ACTION - Board approved Tentative Parcel Map 92-55 based on the findings of the Zoning Administrator, and instructed staff to remove the subject parcel from the Agricultural District boundary on the Public Review Draft General Plan, Project Description and Alternative. CNBNuU
- 81. Hearing to consider the Appeal submitted by Sterling-Gentry, Ltd. on approval of Special Use Permit 94-08 for 7.14 acres in the Diamond Springs Area to allow conversion of an existing 60,000 square foot warehouse/office to a facility where all refuse, currently deposited at the Union Mine Landfill, will be segregated and processed for recycling (District III) Applicant: Western El Dorado Recovery. **BOARD ACTION** - Board adopted the Negative Declaration prepared by the Planning Department, finding that the mitigation conditions as imposed mitigate the impacts to a level of insignificance and, further, that the Mitigated Negative Declaration reflects the independent judgment of the County; directed that changes and additions to conditions as discussed this date be formally made; and, as thereby amended, deemed the application complete and denied the Appeal, adopting the findings presented by staff this date which amplify the findings adopted by the Planning Commission to clarify their intent.
