a. Adoption of Ordinance rezoning (294-04) said lands from CPO-DC, Professional Office Commercial-Design Control Zone to R2-PD, Limited Multifamily Residential-Planned Development Zone;

b. Development Plan 94-01;

c. Tentative Subdivision Map (TM94-1291) creating six phasing lots and 91 single family residential condominium units on 9.2 acres, one 6.3-acre native plant preserve lot, and one 8.9-1142 acre undeveloped lot.
