"Hot Bucket" Item No. 9 Consideration of the following proposed policy regarding separation of communities: "To retain separation of communities between Diamond Springs/El Dorado and Placerville, zoning shall be maintained at the lowest density ranges: Medium Density Residential (MDR) at U.S. Highway 50 and Weber Creek, Low Density Residential (LDR) at State Route 49 and Weber Creek, and Rural Residential (RR) at the future Texas Hill Reservoir site and Weber Creek." BOARD OF SUPERVISORS ACTION: At the recommendation of the Planning Commission the request was continued to such time as the City Council has time to review further, and to be considered with the two-year review of the General Plan. UNBNUS

"Hot Bucket Item No. 10 Consideration of modification to following policies listed on the comments received from the El Dorado County Taxpayers Association dated January 20, 1996: Policies 7.2.1.3, 7.2.2.1, 2.1.4.8, 2.6.1.4.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS ACTION: Board initiated hearings on amendment of the County General Plan to modify the following policies as iterated: **UNBNuS**

Policy 7.2.1.3 The County shall request the State Department of Conservation to conduct a County-wide study to assess the 9399 location and value of non-metallic mineral materials. Once completed, the County may recognize them in the General Plan and rezone them and the surroundings to allow for mineral resource management. The County shall recognize existing deposits which are producing non-metallic resources as suitable for protection.

<u>Policy 7.2.2.1</u> The minimum parcel size within, or adjacent to, areas subject to the -MR (Mineral Resource) overlay shall be ten (10) acres unless the applicant can demonstrate to the approving authority that there are no economically significant mineral deposits on or adjacent to the project site and that the proposed project will have no adverse effect on existing or potential mining operations. <u>If a finding can be made that</u> <u>due to pre-existing incompatible adjacent land uses or other</u> <u>environmental reasons, mining operations are precluded in the</u> <u>area, an assessment of the mineral resources may be waived,</u> <u>due to the fact that no economical significance can be found</u> <u>on deposits that are not minable.</u> The minimum parcel size adjacent to active mining operations which are outside of the -MR overlay shall also be ten (10) acres.

Policy 2.1.4.8 The County, except where the proponent of a particular project has already received one or more discretionary approvals (other than approval of this General Plan) and has committed to fully participate in any funding 9 mechanism to fund infrastructure within the Missouri Flat Area Planned Community, shall not approve any discretionary land use applications within the Missouri Flat Area Planned Community until September 1996 or such time as a specific plan, redevelopment plan, or a master circulation and funding plan is adopted by the County, at which time the Planned Community restriction shall cease to exist and the Missouri Flat (PC5) financial plan and road system will be part of the General Plan circulation plan. The underlying land use designation shall be as specified on the General Plan land use map. The Board of Supervisors in September 1996 may elect to continue this policy or modify it through a General Plan amendment.
