b. Loring H. Brunius, dba Sierra Rock, appealing Conditions 12 and 14 imposed on subject Reclamation Plan.

BOARD ACTION - 1. The Board of Supervisors adopted the Mitigated Negative Declaration for Diamond Quarry Reclamation Plan 90-01, finding that it reflects the independent judgment of the County of El Dorado. 2. The Board adopted the findings of the Planning Commission on July 25, 1997, set forth in the staff report of August 21, 1997, as Exhibit C. 3. The Board approved the Reclamation Plan and Financial Assurances for the Diamond Quarry as adopted by the Planning Commission on July 25, 1997, with the modifications expressed in the staff report of August 21, 1997, and orally by staff here today at this hearing, plus the following conditions: (A) The Reclamation Plan is not effective unless the outstanding processing costs are paid in full by the close of business on September 12, 1997. (B) The financial assurances are to be posted no later that 15 working days from this date. (C) The Reclamation Plan will be reviewed by the Planning Commission at a hearing at the end of one year. At that time, the County can affirm, modify or terminate the Reclamation Plan based on evidence presented to it. This is in addition to the 5-year review already provided for in the Plan. Over the next year, staff is directed to work with the operator, a County-retained geotechnical consultant and the Department of Conservation to resolve the outstanding concerns expressed by the State. This is not to be construed as an admission that the Reclamation Plan as adopted this date is not in compliance with the requirements of law including SMARA (Surface Mining and Reclamation Act), but as an attempt to further improve the Plan and satisfy the State that its concerns are addressed. 4. 
