substance field. abuse confidentiality is governed by federal law [(42 U.S.C. § 290dd-2) and regulations (42 CFR Part 2)] that outlines what limited circumstances under information about the client's treatment may be disclosed, with and without the client's consent. 42 CFR Part 2 applies to all records relating to the identity, diagnosis, prognosis, or treatment of any patient in a substance abuse program that is conducted, regulated, or directly or indirectly assisted by any department or agency of the United States.



Contracted Services

El Dorado County Alcohol & Drug Programs contracts with community agencies to provide alcohol and drug treatment services. Pregnant women receive admission preference to any substance use treatment. Women with children may enter treatment and recovery services with their children.
