These assessments provide an excellent opportunity to evaluate your child's oral health and detect any potential issues early on. During the assessments, our friendly dental professionals will conduct a comprehensive examination, checking for tooth decay, gum disease, and other oral health indicators. They will also provide personalized oral hygiene guidance, emphasizing the importance of brushing, flossing, and maintaining a balanced diet for optimal oral health.

El Dorado Community Health Center Open to New Patients

The El Dorado Community Health Center (EDCHC), a local non-profit organization, provides general and family dentistry from ages sixmonths and up at their state-of-the art centers in Cameron Park and Placerville.

El Dorado County Office of Education collaborates with EDCHC to provide cleanings, digital X-rays, and exams on our county's state-of-the art dental mobile van that comes to the schools, making it convenient for students and parents.

At EDCHC clinics, their skilled providers, including general dentists, dental hygienists, and a board-certified pediatric dentist provide quality and personalized dental care, with strong emphasis on prevention and conservative approach. A wide variety of pediatric dental services are available to help kids get the care they need including minimally invasive dentistry, Nitrous Oxide (laughing gas), and specialized pediatric dentistry.

school, California law requires that children have a dental assessment by May 31 in either kindergarten or first grade, whichever is their first year in public school.


