

Dear Director and Board Members:

In accordance with provisions of Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, I hereby submit the 1980 El Dorado County Crop Report.

The gross agricultural value has decreased approximately \$21 million from the high gross income reported in 1979 of \$48½ million. The primary reason for this decrease is that the timber industry, because of a depressed economy, elected not to harvest as much timber. The Eldorado National Forest indicates that timber sales continue at a brisk rate with high prices being paid for the standing timber. Purchasers of national forest timber are allowed five years from time of purchase to when the timber must be harvested.

The County's grape industry continues to expand and has gained statewide recognition for high quality varietal grapes. Five wineries are presently in operation in the County with an additional three to be completed in 1981. This industry is blending well with other recreational and agricultural industries in the County.

With the addition of wineries selling fine varietal wines, the County's ranch marketing program continues to expand and attract recreational visitors to our area. The proximity of El Dorado County to large metropolitan areas promises a very bright future for this type of merchandising. The cherry and plum crops are expanding, but not as rapidly as vineyard plantings. With increased transportation costs, these two crops should have a competitive advantage with out-of-state products in our markets.
