4. OAK TREE ORDINANCE. PRESENTATION BY SHAWNA PURVINES, PRINCIPAL PLANNER.

Shawna Purvines, Principal Planner, was asked to bring the Building Industry Advisory Committee (BIAC) up to date with what the Board of Supervisors is considering with the Oak Woodland Management Plan (OWMP) to implement Option B provisions of General Plan 7.4.4.4.

The Board of Supervisors adopted the Oak Woodland Management Plan to implement Option B provisions of General Plan Policy, and Measure CO-P. These provisions establish an Oak Conservation In-Lieu Fee for the purchase of conservation easements for oak woodland in areas identified as Priority Conservation Areas. In June 2008, a lawsuit was filed challenging the approval of the OWMP. In 2010, the Court ruled to uphold the Board's action to adopt the Plan. On appeal, the Appellate Court over-ruled that decision, remanding the case back to Superior Court, with the direction to require the County to prepare an Environmental Impact Report for the OWMP. The OWMP was rescinded on September 4, 2012 (Resolution 123-2012) and its implementing ordinance was rescinded on September 11, 2012 (Ordinance # 4892). Only Option A of Policy 7.4.4.4 is available to mitigate impacts to oak woodlands.

In September 2012, the Board of Supervisors directed staff to prepare a General Plan Amendment to amend the Conservation of Biological Resources section of the Conservation and Open Space Element of the General Plan and their related implementation measures. In March 2014, the Board approved a three-year contract with consulting firm Dudek to assist the County with this project. In July 2014, Dudek presented the Board with historical background, current status of the six General Plan biological policies. In November 2014, the Board selected the Mitigation/Conservation Approach.

Upcoming Project Schedule includes a Draft EIR Public Review Period (Public Meetings) November-December 2015.

5. REVIEW OF PASS PROGRAM-PREQUALIFIED ARCHITECTURAL SUBMITTAL SYSTEM PRESENTATION BY TOM BURNETTE

Tom Burnette reviewed the PASS Program—Prequalified Architectural Submittal System. The PASS program was designed to provide a more efficient and effective plan review process by implementing a clear and concise set of standards for document content and organization.

The Central Valley chapter of AIA and the Sacramento Valley Chapter of Building Officials developed PASS—a multi-phase program. The initial keynote to the program is the word "prequalified".

A professional or a contractor can complete the class, pass the test, and is then qualified to act as a pre-approved plan checker. The plan checker insures all checklist requirements are met, brings in a Tenant Improvement along with his/her certification to our front counter, and the outline of requirements is reviewed. If all requirements are met, we will issue the permit over the counter. There is an evaluation period, as part of the program. If the building inspector has a problem because the architect/plan checker did not do his part, the building inspector submits a report to a committee. There is a 'strike' placed against the plan checker. Three 'strikes' and the pre-approved plan checker is out of the program. The feedback from the complainant improves the program.

Tom Burnette would like to initiate the program in El Dorado County Building Services and is asking the Building Industry Advisory Committee (BIAC) to assist and evaluate this program. El Dorado County, Building Services plan checkers Chris Simonson, and Steve Frizzle completed a technical requirements training class and successfully passed an exam and are now listed on the PASS registry. The flyer of Frequently Asked Questions is attached.

Structural review, the process of submitting a complete corrected package prior to submittal is what is required to get a permit. The checklist, to be completed by the architect/ plan checker will be part of the expedited program. Only the certified individual can submit at the counter.

The cost of the class is \$600.00. Discounts are available for jurisdictions.

Commercial tenant improvements is a starting point with this new program. Expansion into other types of permits are in the plans. Tom Burnette believes it is a cooperative effort along with BIAC. Tom Burnette believes that BIAC is the correct avenue to bring this program to the Board. Tom Burnette would like to get a letter to the Board, and a group made up of a few members from BIAC, county employees, and management to present to the Board this program, as soon as possible.

Jerry Homme supports the program due to the expedited process, the convenience, and the cost savings to everyone involved. Earl McGuire stated the time savings will offset the costs involved.

Earl McGuire moved to endorse the PASS Program. Jerry Homme seconded.
