

## El Dorado County to Perform Concrete Delivery and Placement for Pier 2 Footing Mosquito Road Bridge Replacement Project

## Mosquito Road Closure April 5, 2024 at 8:00 pm through April 6, 2024 to 5:00 pm

(PLACERVILLE, CA) -- El Dorado County's Department of Transportation (DOT) will be performing an 1,100 cubic yard concrete delivery and placement on Mosquito Road between 0.6 miles north to 0.8 miles south of the Mosquito Road Bridge. The construction work will require full closure of Mosquito Road at the gates beginning Friday, April 5, 2024 at 8:00 pm, and continue through Saturday, April 6, 2024 at 5:00 pm. A detour has been established via Rock Creek Road for which motorists should expect delays and allow extra time for travel.

The Mosquito Road closure is necessary to enhance motorist and worker safety while the County's Contractor performs concrete delivery and placement of 1,100 cubic yards of concrete for the Pier 2 footing at the south side of the Project. This equates to 120 concrete truckloads at an estimated 10 truckloads leaving and 10 empties returning per hour down Mosquito Road from/to Highway 50. Closure of Mosquito Road at the gates will reduce conflicts between the concrete trucks, pumps, and workers during the nighttime concrete placement from 8:00 pm Friday night through 5:00 pm Saturday afternoon. The concrete truck route will be from Highway 50 approximately 5 miles down Mosquito Road to the south Project staging area. The County has coordinated with Caltrans and the City of Placerville to turn all east and west bound traffic lights to green on Highway 50 from Friday, April 5, 2024 at 9:00 pm until Saturday, April 6, 2024 at 11:00 am. The public will need to utilize Rock Creek Road for access to the Swansboro community and expect delays coming down Mosquito Road during the nighttime concrete placement, to be extra cautious on the narrow and winding Mosquito Road. Flaggers will be stationed above the gates at adequate turn around areas and to coordinate with Emergency Services if needed.

The County sincerely appreciates the cooperation and patience of motorists that use this roadway, and we apologize for any inconvenience resulting from this closure.
