**El Dorado County to Perform Road Work
Mosquito Road Bridge Replacement**

Road Closure from September 4, 2024 at 7:00 pm through September 5, 2024 at 3:00 am

August 30, 2024

(PLACERVILLE, CA) -- El Dorado County's Department of Transportation (DOT) will be performing emergency crane maintenance on Mosquito Road from 0.6 miles north to 0.8 miles south of the Mosquito Road Bridge. The crane maintenance work will require full closure of Mosquito Road at the gates beginning Wednesday, September 4, 2024 at 7:00 pm and continue through Thursday, September 5, 2024 at 3:00 am. A detour has been established via Rock Creek Road for which motorists should expect delays and allow extra time for travel.

The closure is necessary to lay the crane boom down on Mosquito Road at the north Project (Pier 3) location to perform emergency maintenance on the boom lines. Mosquito Road will be impassable until the work is complete, and the boom is raised back into position. Mosquito Road will be closed at the gates to ensure motorist and worker safety while the County's contractor performs the crane maintenance work.

In case of a severe public emergency, coordination with Emergency Services will occur for the crane boom to be raised to allow for safe passage.

The County sincerely appreciates the cooperation and patience of motorists that use this roadway, and we apologize for any inconvenience resulting from this closure.
