Mosquito Road Bridge Replacement
Reversing Traffic Control & Pilot Vehicle on Mosquito Road at Kona Drive
September 6, 2024 at 6:00 am through September 6, 2024 at 5:00 pm**

(PLACERVILLE, CA) -- El Dorado County's Department of Transportation (DOT) will be performing patch repairs on Mosquito Road between Kona Drive and 8721 Mosquito Road.

The reversing controls and pilot vehicle are necessary to maintain traffic flow through the work areas on Mosquito Road during asphalt patch repair / paving work. This work has fortunately been scheduled for Friday, September 6, 2024, to take advantage of an opening in the paving Contractor's schedule.

The pilot vehicle will be moving traffic each direction continuously during the work shift. The average time through the work zone is five minutes. Traffic stops at the flagging stations will be maintained at five to ten minutes maximum. Drivers in this area are cautioned to plan extra time for these delays. **The seven affected driveways within the work zone will be posted, "STOP! Please Wait for Pilot Vehicle". Drivers pulling out onto Mosquito Road from these driveways must not pull out until the pilot vehicle and traffic queue passes in the direction of intended one way travel.**

The County sincerely appreciates the cooperation and patience of motorists that use this roadway, and we apologize for any inconvenience as a result of this traffic control and associated road repair work.
