EDSWAC Meeting November 14, 2016 El Dorado County Staff Update

1. Grants

- a. Waste Tire Amnesty Grant: Events take place on the third Saturday of each month until the grant term ends (4/15/2017) or funds are exhausted (whichever occurs first). Collection of residential waste tires 24" inside tire diameter or smaller (off the rim).
 - I. EDD to date has collected 7,439 waste tires
 - II. STR to date has collected 480 waste tires
 - III. EMD hosted two one-time collection events in the north and south areas of the county to reach the rural residents.
 - Somerset 10/8/16: 319 waste tires collected
 - Georgetown 10/22/16: 690 waste tires collected

- b. Waste Tire Enforcement Grants (TEA): Inspection program to ensure facilities that have waste tires are in compliance with waste tire storage and hauling regulations.
 - I. TEA 22: Final reimbursement received.
 - II. TEA 23: 5 months into TEA 23. On par to meet the commitments of the grant within budget
 - III. TEA 24: Application in progress Due December 8th.
- c. City County Payment Program: Enhance bottle/can recycling and litter abatement programs.
 - I. Purchase request for the new trash/recycling bins for Main Street Placerville submitted 9/14/16.
 - II. As of 11/6/2016, they have not been shipped.
 - III. Will be purchasing a new Litter Abatement Program truck to replace of our current truck that has many miles and is having mechanical issues.

2. Construction and Demolition

- a. Use of a Franchise Waste Hauler (Option 1): Staff has been calling permittees who have selected Option 1 but have not yet set up accounts with their respective hauler.
- b. Waste Stream Reduction Alternative (Option 2): Staff will be auditing select types of Option 2 projects to gather data on the amount and types of debris being generated. With this data, we aim to create a guide outlining what types of projects can use option 2 and have documented evaluation to support our decision.
- c. Updating forms and website.

3. Franchise Management

a. EMD attended the Eastern Regional Landfill Quarterly Meeting. Attendees included TTSD, Placer County, Nevada County, and the Town of Truckee. Discussion topics included MCR, disposal reporting, and MORe. Following the meeting Staff received a tour of the EAR MRF/TS and landfill.

4. Solid Waste Management Plan Update

- a. Environmentally Preferable Purchasing Policy Update:
 - I. Draft EPPP provided for discussion at today's meeting.
- b. Waste Characterization:
 - I. In progress. Using data provided to CalRecycle by El Dorado Disposal in 2014 for the Statewide Waste Characterization Study conducted by Cascadia Consulting Group. A

preliminary look at the data suggests that the majority of the waste generated from single family and multi-family residences in El Dorado County is organics; namely food. II. Waste audits planned to be performed by EDD and TTSD this November or December. EMD plans to be present.

- c. Recycling Market Development Zone (RMDZ): RMDZ program combines recycling with economic development to fuel new businesses, expand existing ones, create jobs, and divert waste from landfills.
 - I. Staff has begun filling out the RMDZ application. We will be collaborating with the CDA Planning Division and CAO Economic Development Division to draft a comprehensive application. Staff will be attending the RMDZ Administrator Workshop training November 16-17 for guidance on filling out the RMDZ application and program implementation.

5. Meeting AB 939 / AB 341 Goals / SB1016 Graph

- a. EDD and STR Tonnage /Disposal Data will be provided at the January EDSWAC meeting.
- b. PARIS reporting will be provided at the January EDSWAC meeting.

6. Legislative / Regulatory Update?

a. AB 901: Recycling and Disposal Facility Reporting

Changes how disposal and recycling is reported to CalRecycle. Waste, recycling, and compost facilities, as well as exporters, brokers, and transporters of recyclables or compost will be required to submit information directly to CalRecycle on the types, quantities, and destinations of materials that are disposed of, sold, or transferred inside or outside of the state. Target implementation: Quarter 1, 2018

b. AB 876: Organics Management Infrastructure Planning Requires additional information be reported in the 2016 EAR (Due August 2017). Required information includes:

- I. An estimate of the amount of organic waste in cubic yards that will be disposed by the county over a 15-year period.
- II. An estimate of the additional organic waste recycling facility capacity in cubic yards that will be needed to process the amount of organic waste identified above.
- III. Areas identified by the county as locations for new or expanded organic waste recycling facilities capable of safely meeting the additional organic waste recycling facility capacity need identified above.

7. EMD Staffing

a. New Environmental Management Program Manager – Jeff Warren. For the last 20 ½ years, Jeff worked for the Orange County Health Care Agency in Environmental Health mainly in the Food and Pool Protection Program. He has managed programs ranging from inspection services to disaster preparedness/bioterrorism. Jeff is managing the Environmental Health programs within Environmental Management. Barbara Houghton is now managing the Solid Waste, Hazardous Materials, and Union Mine Landfill programs within Environmental Management.
