Environmental Management – No Update From Prior Week

• Alternate Program

- 5221 Butte Creek Road- waiting on soil sample results. Deed Restriction has been recorded 12/16/2022.
- 4991 Sciaroni Rd (USPS) Soil Sample results submitted. Waiting on final close out paperwork from the contractor.

Land Use

- Fee Waivers 133 received
 - Temporary Mobile Homes/Temporary Recreational Vehicles
 - 79 Received
 - 97 Approved (even if they didn't request a TRV/TMH but were eligible for a fee waiver, TRV/TMH permit fees are included in the approved waiver along with the requested permit fees to avoid the need for additional fee waiver requests/approval should the need the TRV/TMH permit)

• Single Family Home Rebuild Permits – 71 received

- Replacement Home Permits 57 received, 31 issued, 26 pending
- Home Repair Permits 10 received, 3 issued, 7 pending
- Convert Mobile Home to Permanent Permits 4 received, 3 issued, 1 pending
