Please accept this memo as a weekly update to the activities surrounding the County of El Dorado's recovery from the Caldor Fire as managed by the Recovery Operations Center's (ROC) co-directors Sgt. Moke Auwae and me.

### Environmental Management

- **Alternate Program**
  - 7255 Winding Way- Waiting on soil sample results
  - 5221 Butte Creek Road- waiting on soil sample results
  - USPS Parcel is waiting on soil sample results.
  - The above three parcels will receive a letter from EMD that a deed restriction will be placed on their properties due to the delinquencies in getting soil sample results.

### Land Use

- **Fee Waivers** – 126 received
  - Temporary Mobile Homes/Temporary Recreational Vehicles
    - 72 Received
    - 88 Approved (even if parcel owners didn't request a TRV/TMH but were eligible for temporary power and demo permit, we included TRV/TMH in the initial approval in case of future need)
  
- **Rebuild Permits** – 58 received
  - 3 Building Permits Submitted & approved w/ Permit Fees Waived
  - 33 Building Permits Issued w/out Permit Fees Waived
  - 22 Building Permits Pending w/out Permit Fees Waived
  
- **TRV Building Permits** – 49 Received
  - 34 Issued
  - 15 Pending
