Environmental Management

Land Use

- **Fee Waivers** 137 received
 - o Temporary Mobile Homes/Temporary Recreational Vehicles
 - 83 Received
 - 98 Approved (even if they didn't request a TRV/TMH but were eligible for a
 fee waiver, TRV/TMH permit fees are included in the approved waiver along
 with the requested permit fees to avoid the need for additional fee waiver
 requests/approval should the need the TRV/TMH permit)
- Single Family Home Rebuild Permits 75 received
 - o Replacement Home Permits 61 received, 30 issued, 31 pending
 - Home Repair Permits 10 received, 3 issued, 7 pending
 - o Convert Mobile Home to Permanent Permits 4 received, 3 issued, 1 pending

- o CalHome Notice of Funding Availability was released
- The CalHome program will provide the gap funding needed for the survivors to use the voluntary rebuild program.

• Tool Shed

o Continues to support survivors will tool loans.

Immediate Needs

- Ocontinuing to distribute winter needs. We have helped 23 households which include 57 individuals and we have identified 29 more households in our 2nd tier of need that will be receiving supplies next week.
 - Items include: tarps, electric and propane heaters, electric blankets, snow shovels and other winter essentials identified by the Salvation Army and West Slope Foundation.
- o Distribution events: Registration is now open for 2023
 - Announcing Program Lifetime Registration Option (survivors will register onetime only for all distributions)
- We are starting to work what survivors will need for the spring by way of another needs assessment survey.
- o The next Distribution Event will take place on Sunday, February 26th from 12 1 pm.
