Please accept this memo as a weekly update to the activities surrounding the County of El Dorado's recovery from the Caldor Fire as managed by the Recovery Operations Center's (ROC) co-directors Sgt. Moke Auwae and me.

Environmental Management

- **Alternate Program**
 - 5221 Butte Creek Road- Soil Sample results submitted. Waiting on final close out paperwork from the contractor.
 - 4991 Sciaroni Rd (USPS) – Soil Sample results submitted. Waiting on final close out paperwork from the contractor.

Land Use – No Update from Prior Week

- **Fee Waivers** – 133 received
 - Temporary Mobile Homes/Temporary Recreational Vehicles
 - 79 Received
 - 97 Approved (even if they didn't request a TRV/TMH but were eligible for a fee waiver, TRV/TMH permit fees are included in the approved waiver along with the requested permit fees to avoid the need for additional fee waiver requests/approval should the need the TRV/TMH permit)
- **Single Family Home Rebuild Permits** – 71 received
 - Replacement Home Permits – 57 received, 31 issued, 26 pending
 - Home Repair Permits – 10 received, 3 issued, 7 pending
 - Convert Mobile Home to Permanent Permits – 4 received, 3 issued, 1 pending
- **TRV Permits** – 50 Received
 - 39 Issued
 - 11 Pending

Health and Human Services Agency

- **Long-Term Recovery**

- **Salvation Army**
 - The Disaster Case Managers (DCMs) did not receive any storm-related requests from survivors on their caseload.
- **Social Worker**
 - Due to poor weather conditions, the Social Worker and Mental Health Worker will not be at Pioneer Park Community Center on January 5, 2023.
 - The Social Worker continues to provide support to a survivor in the HDAP program.
- **Mental Health Worker**
 - A survivor was in need of tarps due to the recent storms and was connected with the West Slope Foundation.
 - They received two new referrals from the DCMs and have informed them of resources offered by the Behavioral Health Department.
