RE: Caldor Recovery update

Please accept this memo as a weekly update to the activities surrounding the County of El Dorado's recovery from the Caldor Fire as managed by the Recovery Operations Center's (ROC) co-directors Sgt. Moke Auwae and me.

Environmental Management

• Alternate Program

- o 29 applications received
- o 29 work plans received
- o 28 work plans approved
- o 26 parcels cleaned and sampled
- o 20 parcels have submitted completion reports
- 20 parcels have completed the Alternate Program, 15 in Grizzly Flats and 5 in Tahoe Basin
- o Abatement extension letters have been issued to 7 properties.
- 2 parcels moving forward in the abatement process

USFS Parcels

- o USFS ROE program closed 6/20
- o 171 USFS ROEs received
- o 171 ROEs have been uploaded into the SmartSheet
- o Total number of eligible USFS parcels is 177

Public Program

- o 591 debris removal complete (77%)
- o 588 Soil Samples approved (77%)
- o 28,274 Trees felled (100%)
- o 672 parcels with completed tree felling (100%)
- o 27,713 tree removal complete (98%)
- o 655 parcels with tree removal completed (98%)
- o 556 completed Full ROE final sign off (returned to owners)
- o 168 Tree-only final sign off (returned to owners)

Land Use

- Fee Waivers 74 received
 - o Temporary Mobile Homes/Temporary Recreational Vehicles
 - 48 Received
 - 51 Approved
- **Rebuild Permits** 21 received
 - o 2 Building Permits Submitted w/ Permit Fees Waived
 - o 1 Building Permits Issued/Approved w/ Permit Fees Waived
 - o 12 Building Permits Submitted w/out Permit Fees Waived
 - o 3 Building Permits Issued/Approved w/out Permit Fees Waived
- **Sierra At Tahoe** resubmitted their revised documents/plans last week. Those resubmitted documents/plans are currently being reviewed. At this point in the re-review, it appears a grading permit will now be required for this project.
- Continued to field calls and remains re: status of clean-up efforts

Health and Human Services Agency

- Long Term Recovery
 - o No meeting this reporting week.
- Immediate Needs
 - o The next distribution event will be on July 17th at Pioneer Elementary School and HHSA will attend.
 - There is a planned cleanup event on August 1st with more details to come from the West Slope Foundation.
 - o The 1 year anniversary event will be on August 13th (flyer below)
- Salvation Army
 - o DCM is sending over the survivor waitlist to the Caldor Social Worker to continue screening individuals for HDAP.
- Social Worker
 - o Once we receive SA's waitlist, then the Caldor Social Worker will call and assess them for Housing and Disability Advocacy Program (HDAP).
 - We currently have four Caldor HDAP referrals. Three were not eligible; Social Worker needs to assess the condition of the last survivor's trailer before making a determination.
 - o Social Worker will continue assisting with the other HDAP referrals.
- Mental Health Worker
 - o Start date of 7/30
 - o New Morning is offering a support group for Caldor survivors (flyer below).
